Notice of Workshop to Solicit Comments on Proposed Regulations

The Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) is proposing the amendment of regulations pertaining to Chapter 483 of Nevada Administrative Code. A Public Workshop has been set for:

Wednesday, September 23, 2020 at 9:00am

The purpose of the workshop is to solicit comments from interested person on the following general topic(s):

- Create a defining for an alternate services transaction
- Revise sections to allow driver license and identifications cards to be renewed using alternate services

A reasonable fee for copying may be charged. The agency's small business impact is attached.

Public comment may be limited to three minutes per speaker and will not be restricted based on viewpoint. Members of the public are encouraged to submit written comments for the record. Due to time considerations, the duration of the hearing may be limited. Reasonable efforts will be made to accept testimony from all participants.

The following information is provided pursuant to the requirements of NRS 233B.0603:

1. The need for and the purpose of the proposed regulation or amendment.

To amend regulations to allow the DMV the authority to provide driver license or identification card transactions to its customers.

2. Either the terms or the substance of the regulations to be adopted, amended or repealed, or a description of the subjects and issues involved.

The proposed regulations establish authority for the DMV to provide driver license and identification card renewals using services other than in-office transactions. This will expand the online and by-mail services to additional customers.

3. The estimated economic effect of the regulation on the business which it is to regulate and on the public. These must be stated separately and, in each case, must include:

(a) Adverse and beneficial effects

- i. Adverse: The Department does not foresee any adverse impact on businesses.
- ii. Beneficial: The Department does not foresee any economic benefit to businesses.

(b) Both immediate and long-term effects.

- i. Immediate: The Department does not foresee any immediate impact on businesses.
- ii. Long-term: The Department does not foresee any long-term impact on businesses.

4. The estimated cost to the agency for enforcement of the proposed regulation.

There is no additional cost to the Department for the enforcement of the proposed regulations.

5. A description of and citation to any regulations of other state or local governmental agencies which the proposed regulation overlaps or duplicates and a statement explaining why the duplication or overlapping is necessary. If the proposed regulation overlaps or duplicates a federal regulation, the notice must include the name of the regulating federal agency.

The proposed regulations are neither duplicative nor overlapping of federal, state or local standards.

- 6. If the regulation is required pursuant to federal law, a citation and description of the federal law.**

The proposed regulation is not required pursuant to federal law.

- 7. If the regulation includes provisions which are more stringent than a federal regulation that regulates the same activity, a summary of such provisions.**

The proposed regulations are not more stringent than any federal regulation which regulates the same activity.

- 8. Whether the proposed regulation establishes a new fee or increases an existing fee.**

The regulation does not propose any new fees or increase in existing fees.
