NOTICE OF HEARING INTENT TO ACT UPON A REGULATION

Notice of Hearing for the Adoption of LCB No. R049-16 of the Board of Registered Environmental Health Specialists

The purpose of the hearing is to receive comments from all interested parties regarding the adoption of regulations that pertain to R049-16, Chapter 625A of the Nevada Administrative Code.

The following information is provided pursuant to the requirements of NRS 233B.0603:

LCB File No. R049-16

- 1. The need and purpose of the proposed regulation is to protect the public health, safety and welfare by ensuring that only qualified and competent environmental health specialists and trainees are registered to practice in the state.
- 2. The proposed regulation will provide clarity for the public, individuals and registrants by making various changes to the procedures for application for and renewal of a certificate of registration as an environmental health specialist or environmental health specialist trainee; interprets the term "basic science courses", requires notification to the Board of a name change, requires certain communications and documents to be address to the Board, establishes certain fees, defines the term "environmental health sciences", revises requirements for continuing education and provides other matters properly relating thereto.

3. Estimated economic effect of regulations on business and the public

a. Adverse and beneficial effects

The adoption of these regulations should have no adverse economic effect on business, the public or environmental health. The benefits of these regulations are that the public and the practitioners will be provided clarity in NAC 625A.

b. <u>Immediate and long-term effects</u>

The immediate and long-term effects of the regulations proposed in R049-16 will be clarity and consistency in regulation and registration of environmental health specialists and environmental health specialist trainees in Nevada.

4. Cost for enforcement of the regulations

There are no additional costs involved in enforcing the proposed regulations.

5. Overlap or duplication of other state or local governmental agencies or federal regulation

The proposed regulations do not overlap or duplicate any regulation of other state or local governmental entities or federal regulation.

- 6. Regulation required by federal law Not applicable
- 7. <u>More stringent than federal regulations The Board is not aware of any similar federal regulations of the same activity in which the state regulations are more stringent.</u>
- 8. New or increases in existing fees The proposed regulation does not include new or increases in existing fees. The proposed regulation does establish in regulation the fees and amounts authorized by NRS 625A.130 for the application, registration, renewal of registrations and the amount charged for reexamination of an applicant.

Persons wishing to comment on the proposed action of the Board of Registered Environmental Health Specialists may appear at the scheduled public hearing or address their comments, data, views or arguments in written form to the Board of Registered Environmental Health Specialists, 6160 Mae Anne Ave., Suite 3, Reno, Nevada 89523. The Board of Registered Environmental Health Specialists must receive all written submissions on or before December 31, 2016. If no person who is directly affected by the proposed action appears to request time to make an oral presentation, the Board of Registered Environmental Health Specialists may proceed immediately to action upon any written submissions.

Upon adoption of any regulations, the agency, if requested to do so by an interested person, either before adoption or within 30 days thereafter, will issue a concise statement of the principal reasons for and against its adoption or incorporate therein its reason for overruling the consideration urged against its adoption.
