Notice of Hearing for the Adoption of Regulations of the Commission on Professional Standards in Education as proposed in LCB File #T008-22

The Commission on Professional Standards in Education will hold a public hearing at 9:05 A.M. on Wednesday, April 19, 2023 via <u>livestream</u> and at the following locations: Nevada Department of Education Offices, 700 East Fifth Street, Board Room, Carson City and 2080 East Flamingo Road, Room 114, Las Vegas, Nevada. The purpose of the hearing is to receive comments from all interested persons regarding the amendment of regulations pertaining to Chapter 391.056 of the Nevada Administrative Code (NAC) pursuant to the Nevada Revised Statue (NRS) 391.019, 391.021, and 391.032.

The following information is provided pursuant to the requirements of Nevada Revised Statute (NRS) 233B.0603:

- 1. The need and the purpose of the proposed regulations and/or amendments: In accordance with NRS 391.019, the Commission on Professional Standards in Education is instructed to adopt regulations:
 - Prescribing the qualifications for licensing teachers and other educational personnel and the procedures for the issuance and renewal of those licenses.

NRS 391.032 notes that the Commission shall:

- Adopt regulations which provided for the issuance of provisional licenses to teachers and other educational personnel before completion of all courses of study or other requirements for a license in this State.
- **2. Description of the proposed regulation, or the subjects and issues involved:** The proposed regulation revises the length of validity for a provisional nonrenewable license issued by the Superintendent of Public Instruction from one or two years to three years.

The revised text of the proposed regulation is attached to this notice.

3. Estimated economic effect of the regulation on the business which it is to regulate and on the public: There is no economic effect of the regulation on the business that it regulates and no impact on the public.

- **4. Methods used by the agency in determining the impact on a small business:** Small business are not impacted by this regulation.
- 5. The estimated cost to the agency for enforcement of the proposed regulation: No costs.

PROPOSED TEMPORARY REGULATION OF THE COMMISSION ON PROFESSIONAL STANDARDS IN EDUCATION

The following document is the temporary regulation proposed by the agency submitted on 10/12/2022

NAC 391.056 Provisional nonrenewable licensure: Qualifications; term of validity; addition of endorsements. (NRS 391.019, 391.021, 391.032)

- 1. The Superintendent of Public Instruction may issue a provisional nonrenewable license to an applicant applying for a license pursuant to NAC 391.045. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 2, a provisional nonrenewable license is valid for:
- (a) One year Three years, if the applicant otherwise meets the requirements for a license pursuant to NAC 391.045, but:
- (1) Except as otherwise provided in paragraph (c), has a deficiency in credits of 6 semester hours or less for all areas of licensure or endorsement, unless the provision is for an endorsement as a substitute teacher; or
- (2) If the applicant is applying for a school counseling endorsement pursuant to NAC 391.185, lacks confirmation from a college that the applicant has completed a school counseling practicum or internship, but:
- (I) Has completed all necessary course-work requirements for the school counseling endorsement;
- (II) Has completed 200 hours of the practicum or internship through a regionally accredited college or university, including, without limitation, a minimum of 100 hours in a school setting at the time of his or her application for licensure; and
- (III) Is currently and continuously enrolled in a regionally accredited college or university school counseling practicum or internship program;
- (b) Two Three years, if the applicant has not passed the tests required by NAC 391.036 and is not exempt from taking such tests; or
- (c) Three years, if the applicant has not completed the course required by paragraph (b) of subsection 1 of NAC 391.045.
- 2. If each provision is removed on or before the date on which a license issued pursuant to this section is set to expire pursuant to subsection 1, the license expires 3 years after the date on which the license was issued.
- 3. The holder of a license issued pursuant to this section may add endorsements with provisions to the license during the first year in which the license is valid. Endorsements without provisions may be added to the license at any time during the period in which the license is valid. If an endorsement is added to the license, the endorsement does not affect the date on which the license becomes invalid.

PROPOSED TEMPORARY REGULATION OF THE COMMISSION ON PROFESSIONAL STANDARDS IN EDUCATION

The following document is the temporary regulation proposed by the agency submitted on 10/12/2022

NAC 391.XXX Visiting International Teacher License

- 1. For purposes of this subsection, Visiting International Teacher Program is defined as a J-1 Visa Exchange Visitor Program officially approved by the United States Department of State.
- 2. The department will issue a special license with an endorsement as a visiting international teacher to an individual who meets the conditions and requirements specified in this subsection.

 The individual must:
 - (a) meet appropriate requirements prescribed NAC 391.045;
- (b) be employed by a school district participating in a Visiting International Teacher Program;
- (c) hold valid teaching credentials from the country of origin based, at a minimum, on the equivalent of a bachelor's degree issued by an institution of higher education in the United States accredited or otherwise approved by an accrediting organization recognized by the U.S. Department of Education;
- (d) demonstrate English language proficiency and subject matter competence in subject area(s) taught, as verified by the Visiting International Teacher Program sponsor and the employing school district;
 - (e) pay appropriate fee prescribed by NAC 391.045; and
 - (f) submit fingerprints in accordance with NRS 391.033.

- 3. School districts that employ educators with visiting international teacher license agree to provide the visiting international teachers with supervision and regular ongoing support.
- 4. The visiting international teacher license is valid for five years and is non-renewable, for all candidates actively enrolled in and in good standing with a Visiting International Teacher Program as verified by the employing school district.
- 5. Issuance of a visiting international teacher license does not prohibit issuance of provisional, standard, or professional license following a successful review of credentials.
