Section 1. NAC 554.805 is hereby amended to read as follows:

554.805 1. A quarantine is hereby established against Africanized honeybees (*Apis mellifera scutellata*).

- 2. The following areas are under the quarantine:
- (a) Any area within the boundaries of Clark County, Nevada;
- (b) Any portion of Nye County, Nevada, that lies [west of Clark County, Nevada;] south of 37° north latitude; and
 - (c) Any portion of Lincoln County, Nevada, that lies south of 38° north latitude.
