### PROPOSED REGULATION OF THE BOARD OF WILDLIFE COMMISSIONERS

**Authority:** NRS 501.105, 501.119, 501.181,

**EXPLANATION:** This regulation proposes to change the status of the bull frog to unprotected and the northern leopard frog to protected. The widely introduced non-native bull frog has been identified as a threat to native amphibian and fish populations. A change in status would enable appropriate control measures and would eliminate the requirement of a fishing license to harvest bull frogs. The northern leopard frog has reportedly experienced declines across its native range and statutory protection is warranted.

**Section 1.** NAC 503.075 is hereby amended to read as follows:

503.075 1. Amphibians are classified as game, protected, threatened, sensitive, endangered or unprotected amphibians.

2. [The following amphibians are classified as game amphibians:

3.1 The following amphibians are classified as protected:

[4.] 3. Unprotected amphibians are all species of amphibians which are not classified as game, protected, threatened, sensitive or endangered amphibians.

**Section 2.** NAC 502.288 is hereby repealed.

502.288 [ Any person who is 12 years of age or over must possess a fishing license when taking bullfrogs. ]
