### INFORMATIONAL STATEMENT

Posting of the regulation was made in accordance with Nevada's public meeting law. Copies of the regulation were mailed to Wildlife Advisory Boards, sportsman groups and interested persons. Comments received from 2 Wildlife Advisory Boards supported the regulation change. A summary of the comments is available from the Chief of Fisheries.
