NOTICE OF INTENT TO ACT UPON A REGULATION Notice of Hearing for The Adoption of Regulations of The Nevada Board Of Wildlife Commissioners

The Board of Wildlife Commissioners will hold a public hearing at 8:30 a.m., on December 6, 2003 at the Nevada Department of Wildlife, 1100 Valley Road, Reno, Nevada 89512. The purpose of the hearing is to receive comments from all interested persons regarding the adoption of regulation CGR 322 (LCB File #R_____) pertaining to Chapter 503 of the Nevada Administrative Code.

1. The need for and purpose of the proposed regulation or amendment: (Description of regulation)

The proposed regulation changes language regarding the use of electric motors in designated areas and adds the lagoon south of Laughlin within Section 33, T32S.,R66E.,M.D.B.&M., as marked with signs and buoys, or both, to the list of areas limited to vessels without motors and vessels under power of electric motors, for purposes of resource protection. The areas of the lagoon proposed for protection by this regulation are described as "back water areas", utilized by sensitive native fish. A regulation more restrictive than a "flat wake" regulation is required in these areas.

2. The terms or the substance of the regulation to be adopted or a description of the subjects and issues involved:

The regulation proposes to add specific areas of the lagoon south of Laughlin to NAC 488.470, which limits access to vessels without motors and vessels under power of electric motors. A minor change in language to the regulation proposes, vessels under power of electric motors to replace vessels with electric motors. This allows boats with gas motors to operate in the area as long as they are only under power of electric motors when in the designated areas.
