## PROPOSED REGULATION OF THE STATE BOARD OF PHARMACY

## Chapter 639 shall be changed as follows:

NAC 639.2973 Training and certification to administer immunizations. (NRS 454.213, 639.070) Before a pharmacist may enter into a written protocol with a physician to administer immunizations, the pharmacist must be trained and certified to administer immunizations by completing a course provided by *the Nevada College of Pharmacy*, the University of Nevada School of Medicine or a provider approved by the American Council on Pharmaceutical Education that includes:

- 1. Certification in life-saving techniques pursuant to the American Heart Association's Basic Cardiac Life Support for Health Care Providers or its equivalent;
- 2. Education and practical training, including, without limitation, written study materials regarding techniques for administering immunizations;
- 3. Evaluation of the knowledge and technique of the pharmacist in administering immunizations;
- 4. Instruction consistent with the current training guidelines of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention; and
- 5. A minimum of 20 hours of instruction and [experimental] experiential training concerning:
- (a) The standards for pediatric, adolescent and adult immunization practices recommended and approved by the United States Public Health Service Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices:
  - (b) Basic immunology, and vaccine and immunization protection;
  - (c) Diseases that are preventable through vaccination and immunization;
  - (d) Recommended immunization schedules;
  - (e) Vaccine and immunization storage and management;
  - (f) Informed consent;
  - (g) Physiology and techniques for administration of immunizations;
  - (h) Preimmunization and postimmunization assessment and counseling;
  - (i) Immunization reporting and records management; and
  - (j) Identification, response, documentation and reporting of adverse events.

except an abbreviated certification program of instruction and training of less than 20 hours may be conducted for a pharmacist exclusively providing live attenuated influenza vaccine via the nasal passages.
