NOTICE OF INTENT TO ADOPT REGULATIONS

Proposed amendment of NAC 555.100 to 555.235 pertaining to Nursery Stock and Nursery Stock Sales.

Need and purpose of the proposed amendments:

Nevada Revised Statute 555.100 to 555.235 was amended during the last legislative session and changes must be made to Nevada Administrative Code 555.100 to 555.235 to reflect these changes. Additional changes to Nevada Administrative Code 555.100 to 555.235 are being made to clarify the requirements for licensing of businesses that sell nursery stock and for the importation of nursery stock into the state.

Economic effects of these proposed changes on the businesses which it is to regulate:

1. Adverse effects:

No adverse effects to businesses which it is to regulate provided that they are in compliance with the requirements.

2. Beneficial effects:

Small businesses with gross annual sales of nursery stock of less than \$1,000.00 will now be allowed an exemption from the requirement to pay a license fee. Changes in the language of the chapter will clarify for businesses the requirements with regard to who must be licensed.

3. Immediate and long term effects:

The beneficial and adverse effects are the same for the immediate and long-term economic effects.

Economic effects of the proposed amendments on the public:

1. Adverse effects:

2. Beneficial effects:

Clarification of requirements for licensing of businesses which sell nursery stock will lead to more businesses obtaining licenses allowing the Department to increase pest interception and quality control for nursery stock being offered for sale to the public.

Economic cost to the agency for enforcement of the proposed amendments: There will be no additional cost to the agency for enforcement of the amendments. Description of any regulations of any other state, local or federal regulations that the proposed amendments overlap or duplicate: None

Fees:

The proposed amendment contains a new exemption from the license fee for small businesses whose gross annual sales of nursery stock is less than \$1,000.00.

NAC 555.1098 Fees for nursery stock dealer license. [; reduction of fees upon determination of financial hardship by director.] (NRS 555.238)

- [1. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 3 NRS 555.236.1 (f) the minimum annual fee for a nursery license is \$130, to which must be added the following amount for each:
- (a) Additional nursery of a licensee who has paid the minimum [nursery license] fee, \$130.
- (b) Acre of nursery stock in production or portion thereof after the first acre, \$10 up to a maximum additional fee of \$200.
- [(c) Agent acting on behalf of a licensed nursery established in this state and operating outside of the county in which the nursery is located, \$25.]
- (d) Peddler, \$70.
- [2. The director may reduce the amount of the nursery license fee set forth in subsection 1 if:]
- [(a) The applicant for the issuance or renewal of a nursery license submits a written request to the director that includes:
- (1) If he is applying for a renewal of his nursery license the amount of income from the sale of nursery stock that he has received in the 12 months immediately preceding the date of the application and the amount of time that he has been operating a nursery; or
- (2) If he is applying for an initial nursery license the amount of income from the sale of nursery stock he expects to receive in the 12 months immediately following the date of the application; and
- (b) The director determines that the applicant has demonstrated that the payment of the fee set forth in subsection 1 would cause a financial hardship to the applicant that would preclude him from operating a nursery.
- 3. If the director determines pursuant to subsection 2 that a financial hardship exists, the minimum annual fee for a nursery license is \$50, to which must be added the following amount for each:
- (a) Additional nursery of a licensee who has paid the minimum nursery license fee, \$20.

- (b) Acre of nursery stock in production or portion thereof after the first acre, \$2 up to a maximum additional fee of \$20.
- (c) Agent acting on behalf of a licensed nursery established in this state and operating outside of the county in which the nursery is located, \$5.
- (d) Peddler, \$50.1
- 1. Except as otherwise provided in NRS 555.236 an applicant for a nursery stock dealer license must pay to the director for each business location a licensing fee in the following amount:
- (a) For a nursery stock dealer license, a licensing fee of \$130.00.
- (I)For each acre or portion thereof on which nursery stock is produced, after the first acre, \$20.00 up to a maximum of \$200.00.
- 2. For a peddler, a licensing fee of \$200.00. "Peddler" has the meaning ascribed to it in NRS 555.235.
- [4. As used in this section:
- (a) "Agent" has the meaning ascribed to it in NRS 555.238. 5
- (b) "Peddler" has the meaning ascribed to it in NRS 555.238 235.]
- 3. A nursery stock dealer license renewed after the July 1 deadline must be accompanied by a \$75.00 late fee.

SMALL BUSINESS IMPACT DISCLOSURE PROCESS PURSUANT TO 233B "Nevada Administrative Procedures Act"

The purpose of this Small Business Impact Form is to provide a frame work pursuant to NRS 233B.0608 to determine where a small business impact statement is required for submittal of a proposed regulation before the Nevada Department of Agriculture. If questions one (1) and two (2) are answered No, then a small business impact statement is not required. If question one (1) or two (2) is answered with a YES, then a small business impact statement is required prior to conducting a public workshops by the Department.
