A REGULATION relating to motor vehicles; revising provisions governing the issuance to short-term lessors of temporary permits to operate motor vehicles; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Section 1. NAC 482.272 is hereby amended to read as follows:

482.272 1. A short-term lessor who is licensed by the Department may purchase a book containing 50 temporary permits to operate a vehicle. [Each] *In accordance with NRS 482.3965*, *each* temporary permit is valid for [20] 30 days.

- 2. A fee of \$1,000 must be paid for each book of temporary permits.
- 3. A short-term lessor may not purchase or have in his possession more than five books of temporary permits at one time. An additional book of permits may be purchased upon the return of each completed book of permits.
