Section 1. NAC 501.330 is hereby amended to read as follows:

- 501.330 1. On or before November 1 of each year, the Secretary of the Commission shall make available to the public the application form described in NAC 501.300.
- 2. On or before the first meeting of the Commission after January 31 of each year, the Secretary of the Commission shall provide to the Commission an accounting of [the]:
- (a) Seventy-five percent of the amount of money deposited in the Account during the previous calendar year; and
 - (b) All interest earned on the Account during [the previous calendar] that year.
