## PROPOSED REGULATION OF THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION

## NAC 389.655 Passage of proficiency examinations. (NRS 385.080, 389.015)

- 1. *Unless otherwise provided in Section 9,a* pupil must not be given a standard diploma until the pupil has, after entering grade 11, passed:
  - (a) The Nevada High School Proficiency Examination in Reading;
  - (b) The Nevada High School Proficiency Examination in Mathematics; and
- (c) The Nevada High School Proficiency Examination in Writing for the Eleventh Grade and Above.
- → For pupils who graduate from high school before the 2004-2005 school year, the Nevada High School Proficiency Examination in Science must be used solely to gather information and data concerning the examination and must not be used as a condition for receipt of a high school diploma.

- 9. A pupil must receive a standard high school diploma if he has failed to pass the high school proficiency examination in its entirety not less than three times before beginning grade 12, and the pupil:
  - (a) Passes the subject areas of mathematics and reading on the proficiency examination;
  - (b) Has an overall grade point average of not less than 2.75 on a 4.0 grading scale;
  - (c) Satisfies the alternative criteria pursuant to subsection 10;
  - (d) Otherwise satisfies the requirements for graduation from high school; and
  - (e) Has not previously failed to satisfy the alternative criteria in the same subject area.
- 10. Alternative criteria for a pupil to receive a standard high school diploma pursuant to section 9 will be developed as follows:
- (a) The Department of Education, in conjunction with Nevada educators will develop criteria for the submission of a pupil essay, senior project, or portfolio;
- (b) The Department of Education, in conjunction with Nevada educators will develop rubrics for the evaluation of pupil submissions;
- (c) For each pupil submission, a teacher and principal from the pupil's school must certify that the submission is the pupil's own work;
- (d) Pupil submissions must be submitted on the dates specified by the Department of Education;
- (e) Pupil submissions will be scored in a central location by a panel of educators selected and trained by the Department of Education
- (f) Scoring of pupil submissions will occur on dates as determined by the Department of Education.
