NRS 233B.064 Permanent regulations not to be adopted or revised by the Legislative Counsel; agency's reasons for adoption.

Upon adoption of any regulation, the agency, if requested to do so by an interested person before adoption, or within 30 days thereafter, shall issue a concise statement of the principal reasons for and against adoption, and incorporate therein its reasons for overruling the consideration urged against its adoption.

# NEVADA DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE SMALL BUSINESS IMPACT DISCLOSES PROCESS PURSUANT TO 233B "Nevada Administrative Procedures Act"

The purpose of this Small Business Impact Form is to provide a framework pursuant to NRS 233B.0608 to determine where a small business impact statement is required for submittal of a proposed regulation before the Nevada Department of Agriculture. If questions one (1) and two (2) are answered *No*, then a small business impact statement is not required. If question one (1) or question two (2) is answered with a *YES*, then a small business impact statement is required prior to conducting a public workshop(s) by the Department. (This form must be submitted with the proposed regulation when submitted for drafting by LCB and adoption by the Nevada State Board of Agriculture.)

Proposed regulation: NAC 555, pertaining to commercial and private applicators who apply restricted-use pesticides.

#### Part 1

1. Does this proposed regulation impose a direct and significant economic burden upon a small business? No.

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# PROPOSED REGULATION OF THE STATE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE

The proposed changes are in **bold italics**. The text to be deleted is [crossed out].

Authority: NRS 555.355 and NRS 555.400

A REGULATION relating to nonprimary principal commercial and private applicators who apply restricted-use pesticides will be required to obtain continuing education credits as a condition of their restricted-use pesticide certification renewal; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

NAC 555.670 Examinations for certification of nonprimary principal commercial and private applicators: General and specific; written, oral and practical; passing score; requalification; *Requirements for Continuing Education; Continuing Education renewal period.* 

## 1 through 8 remain the same.

- 9. A nonprimary principal commercial and private applicator may not renew his restricted use pesticide certificate unless within the preceding 4 year certification period has completed at least 12 units of continuing education in courses accredited by the Department of which 2 units must include laws and regulations; or, retakes and receives a passing grade on the certification general and at least one category exam;
- (a) The renewal period will be from October 1 through December 31 of the expiration year;
- (b) All acquired continuing education units will be valid up to one year after the expiration of the applicators RUP certification.
- 10. Any continuing education units obtained exceeding the required units shall not be carried over into the succeeding renewal period.
- 11. A nonprimary principal commercial or private applicator may receive credit for the completion of a course of continuing education offered in another state if:
- (a) The course is approved for continuing education by the appropriate agency of the state; and
- (b) Upon completion of the course, the nonprimary principal commercial or private applicator obtains the required information per NAC 555.677(4) as proof of the education received.
- 12. For each course for which a nonprimary principal commercial or private applicator claims one or more units of continuing education, he may request from the sponsor of the course:
- (a) A certificate of completion issued by the sponsor of the course providing information contained in NAC 555.677 (4); or
- (b) Another document or record that in the judgment of the Director adequately establishes that the licensee successfully completed the course.

NAC 555.677 Records of Continuing Education.

- 1. The instructor or sponsoring organization shall, in addition to NAC 555.374, maintain a record of the RUP certificate holders who have successfully completed continuing education for four years from the completion date of the course or program.
- 2. Each RUP certificate holder specified in NAC 555.670 shall maintain a record for four years of all continuing education approval pursuant to NAC 555.675 which he acquired during each RUP certification period.
- 3. The records specified in (1) shall comply with the requirements set forth in NAC 555.374.
- 4. Except as provided in (5), the records specified in (2) shall be completed on a form entitled "Continuing Education Record Renewal Summary" and contain, at a minimum, the following:
  - (a) The RUP certificate holder's name;
  - (b) RUP certification number of the RUP certificate holder's name;
  - (c) The title and location of the instruction;
  - (d) Name of instructor or sponsoring organization, units or hours credited; and
  - (e) The program course number assigned by the Director.
- 5. Certificates of completion or program completion or written statements containing all the information specified in (4), issued by the instructor or sponsoring organization, shall be sufficient to constitute the records specified in (1) or (2).
  - 6. The records specified in (1) shall be submitted to the director upon request.

NAC 555.690 [Testing] Fee for *initial* certification or recertification of nonprimary principal commercial and private applicators. (NRS 555.355, 555.400) The Director will collect a [testing] fee of \$25 for each *initial certification* examination period, recertification, or reexamination period for the issuance of a certificate pursuant to NAC 555.655, before the applicant is examined.
