The estimated economic effect of the proposed regulations on (a) regulated businesses and (b) the public, including, stated separately (i) adverse and beneficial effects, and (ii) immediate and long-term effects: The Division does not estimate any immediate adverse economic effect of the proposed regulations on regulated businesses; the long-term economic effect is the same. The Division does not estimate any immediate adverse economic effect of the proposed regulations on the public. The long-term effect is the same. The Division estimates the immediate beneficial effects on both regulated businesses and the public is the needed additions, clarifications and updates of the proposed regulations already in effect.

The estimated cost to the Division for enforcement of the proposed regulations: The Division estimates that the cost of implementation and enforcement to be minimal if any costs are incurred at all. The Division already enforces substantially similar regulations. These regulations do not appear to place a significant economic burden on the Division.

A description of and citation to any regulations of other state or local governmental agencies which the proposed regulation overlaps or duplicates and a statement explaining why the duplication or overlapping is necessary: In reference to our proposed amendments to NAC 616C.091, Notice of determination to accept or deny claim, the Division has received comments from the Division of Industrial Relations, Department of Business and Industry in that there is a question on whether this provision is within the jurisdiction of the Hearings Division or the Division of Industrial Relations. We ask the Legislative Council Bureau for clarification on this matter. The proposed regulations are not required by federal law, they are, however, more stringent than federal law; there is no equivalent federal law.

Persons wishing to comment upon the proposed action of the Department of Administration, Hearings Division are invited to appear at the scheduled public hearing or may address their comments, data, views or arguments, in written form, to Patti Fox, Department of Administration, Hearings Division, 2200 S. Rancho Drive, Suite 220, Las Vegas, Nevada, 89102 on or before May 16, 2008. If no person who is directly affected by the proposed action appears to request time to make an oral presentation, the Department of Administration, Hearings Division may proceed immediately to act upon any written submissions.
