PROPOSED REGULATION OF THE

BOARD OF MEDICAL EXAMINERS

EXPLANATION - Matter in *italics* is new; matter in brackets [omitted material] is material to be omitted.

AUTHORITY: §1, NRS 630.130, 630.160, 630.261 and 630.268.

A REGULATION relating to physicians; providing for the issuance of a special event limited license for visiting physicians conducting certain demonstrations; prescribing the fee for a special event limited license; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

- **Section 1.** Chapter 630 of NAC is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to read as follows:
- 1. A person shall not conduct demonstrations of medical techniques and procedures, including, without limitation, techniques or procedures concerning the use of a medical device or the injection of a cosmetic substance such as the product known as Botox, unless the person:
 - (a) Is a physician licensed in this State;
 - (b) Holds a special event limited license issued pursuant to this section; or
- (c) Conducts the demonstrations under the supervision of a physician licensed in this State.
- 2. A physician licensed in another state or jurisdiction may apply to the Board for a special event limited license to conduct demonstrations of medical techniques and procedures,

including, without limitation, techniques or procedures concerning the use of a medical device or the injection of a cosmetic substance such as the product known as Botox.

- 3. Each applicant for a special event limited license described in subsection 2 must:
- (a) Not later than 30 days before the date of the first demonstration for which the license is sought, submit to the Board:
- (1) A completed application for the special event limited license on a form approved by the Board; and
 - (2) A fee of \$300.
- (b) Not later than 14 days before the date of the first demonstration for which the license is sought, submit to the Board:
- (1) Verification that the applicant is currently licensed to practice medicine in another state or jurisdiction and is in good standing in that state or jurisdiction;
 - (2) A copy of the applicant's current policy of insurance for medical malpractice; and
- (3) The dates, times and locations of the demonstrations that the applicant plans to conduct.
- (c) Before the date of each demonstration for which the license is sought, submit to the Board:
 - (1) The name of the medical technique or procedure to be performed;
- (2) The full name and address of each patient upon whom the applicant will perform a medical technique or procedure;
- (3) A copy of an informed consent form properly executed for each patient upon whom the applicant will perform a medical technique or procedure;

- (4) A written record of a recent physical examination of each such patient, which must have been performed by the applicant; and
- (5) A written record of the medical history of each such patient, which must have been obtained by the applicant during his physical examination of the patient.
 - 4. A person who holds a special event limited license pursuant to this section:
- (a) May perform medical techniques and procedures pursuant to the license for demonstration purposes only; and
- (b) May not receive any fee or compensation, directly or indirectly, or expect payment of any fee or compensation for performing the medical techniques or procedures.
- 5. If the Board issues a special event limited license to an applicant pursuant to this section:
- (a) The special event limited license is valid for 15 consecutive days from the date of the first demonstration for which the license is sought; and
- (b) The Board will issue an identification card to the applicant which includes, without limitation, the dates during which the special event limited license is valid.
- 6. Any document required to be submitted pursuant to subsection 3 shall be deemed to be submitted to the Board on the date that the document was received by the Board.
