## PROPOSED REGULATION OF THE

EXPLANATION – Matter in *italics* is new; matter in brackets [omitted material] is material to be omitted.

AUTHORITY: §1, NRS 501.105, 501.181 and 503.150.

A REGULATION relating to hunting; revising the prohibition against using a weapon that is equipped with a certain type of sight while hunting; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

**Section 1.** NAC 503.145 is hereby amended to read as follows:

503.145 The Commission hereby establishes the following exception to paragraph (f) of subsection 1 of NRS 503.150. Except as otherwise provided by paragraph (c) of subsection 1 of NAC 503.142, a sight attached to a firearm or longbow that is used to hunt a game mammal or game bird, or a sight attached to a crossbow that is used to hunt a big game mammal, may be illuminated or powered by:

- 1. A battery contained within the sight;
- 2. Light-gathering fiber optics;
- 3. A radioactive isotope such as tritium; or
- 4. Iridescent or fluorescent paint.
- → It is unlawful for a person to hunt a big game mammal, a game mammal or a game bird with a weapon that is equipped with a sight that is capable of casting or projecting a *visible* beam of light from the sight to the animal.
