AUTHORITY: §1, NRS 385.080 and 390.140.

A REGULATION relating to education; revising provisions relating to recommendations for the adoption of textbooks or electronic media; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Section 1. NAC 390.040 is hereby amended to read as follows:

390.040 1. A recommendation for the adoption of a textbook or electronic media must be submitted to the Department of Education, in [December, March or April] compliance with the policies of the Department, to be considered by the State Board of Education. [The State Board may grant exceptions to this requirement if a school district can demonstrate compelling eircumstances why the recommendation was not submitted in December, March or April.

Recommendations submitted after June 30 will not be considered by the State Board.]

2. The Department of Education may delay the consideration of a recommendation for the adoption of a textbook or electronic media if it finds that any of the information required by NAC 390.020 or 390.025, as applicable, is incorrect or inaccurate.

Proposed Amendments to NAC 390.040 to; Recommendations for adoption of textbooks or electronic media: time for submissions; effect for incorrect or inaccurate evaluation.

INFORMATIONAL STATEMENT

The following statement is submitted for adopted amendments to Nevada Administrative Code 390:

- 1. A clear and concise explanation of the need for the adopted regulation.
 - The need for adopting the regulation is to amend the dates that textbook/instructional materials or electronic media to be submitted to the State Board of Education for approval. The amendments to the language will promote a seamless evaluation system for textbook/instructional materials or electronic media.
- 2. Description of how public comment was solicited, a summary of public response, and explanation of how other interested persons may obtain a copy of the summary.

Notice of Workshop to Solicit Comments on Proposed Regulations was sent to approximately 200 individuals and educational organizations. A workshop was held on September 4, 2013; with public comment.

The Notice of Intent to Act Upon a Regulation for public hearing and adoption of amended NAC 390.040; recommendations for adoption of textbooks or electronic media was sent to approximately 200 individuals and educational organization. A public hearing was conducted on October 4, 2013 to provide the opportunity for comments by affected parties and the public. There was no public comment. The State Board of Education adopted the proposed amended regulation.

Summary of Comments:

Workshop comments:

a) Kellie Crosby Sturtz, Chair of the Academic Standards Council, expressed support for the proposed PE Standards. The Academic Standards Council reviewed and discussed the standards at their recent meeting; and discussed the diversity component. Ms. Sturtz stated that she supports teaching diversity as that should not be the sole responsibility of PE teachers, and that is the only place it appeared in the standards; the Council supported the removal of that language in the standards.

- b) Alexandra Profant, from Incline Village, Nevada said Washoe County School District (WCSD) has exceptional opportunities for students to look at diversity within the scope of the supervised PE curriculum. Ms. Profant stated that her daughter studies ballet and through interaction with WCSD supervised curriculum was able to host different tracks with her in a professional and physical realm based on the supervised curriculum. Ms. Profant expressed her hope that this will not disappear with the standards and acknowledged there is diversity in the curriculum.
- c) Mary Pike stated that Clark County School District supports adopting the proposed PE standards
