COMMISSION GENERAL REGULATION NUMBER 432

EXPLANATION - Matter in *italics* is new; matter in brackets formitted material; is material to be omitted.

AUTHORITY: §1, NRS 488.045, 488.059, 501.181, 501.243.

A REGULATION relating to wildlife; establishes provisions pertaining to vessel reduced speed required on Jiggs Reservoir.

Section 1. Chapter 488 of NAC is hereby amended by adding thereto section 2, inclusive of this regulation, to read as follows.

Section 2. NAC 488.455 Areas in which reduced speed required.

1. On the following waters, a vessel must be operated at a speed that leaves a flat wake, but in no case may a vessel be operated at a speed in excess of 5 nautical miles per hour:
