EXPLANATION – Matter in *italics* is new; matter in brackets [omitted material] is material to be omitted.

AUTHORITY: §1, NRS 586.270 and 586.401.

A REGULATION relating to agriculture; increasing the amount of the portion of each annual pesticide registration fee that is used for certain purposes; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

- **Section 1.** NAC 586.011 is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 586.011 1. Each registrant must pay an annual registration fee of \$125 for each pesticide registered.
- 2. The Director will deposit, in a separate account, [\$15] \$40 of each annual registration fee collected pursuant to subsection 1. The money in the account will be used to:
 - (a) Monitor and dispose of pesticides;
 - (b) Protect groundwater and surface water from contamination by pesticides; and
 - (c) Eradicate and control noxious weeds.

NOTICE OF ADOPTION OF REGULATION

The Nevada Department of Agriculture adopted regulations assigned LCB File No. R115-13 which pertain to chapter 586 of the Nevada Administrative Code on December 23, 2013. A copy of the regulations as adopted is attached hereto.

LEGISLATIVE REVIEW OF ADOPTED REGULATIONS--NRS 233B.066 **Informational Statement** LCB File No. R115-13

1. A clear and concise explanation of the need for the adopted regulation.

A previously approved regulation to increase this fee increased the fee but neglected to increase the set aside. This proposed regulation change would correct that oversight and increase the allowed set aside from \$15 per registration to \$40 per registration. This is an adjustment to the portion of the pesticide registration fee that is used for certain purposes, NOT an additional fee increase.

The purpose of or need for the regulation is to make available additional funds to monitor or dispose of pesticides, protect ground and surface water from contamination, and to eradicate and control noxious weeds.

Section 1. NAC 586.011:

586.011 1. Each registrant must pay an annual registration fee of \$125 for each pesticide registered.

- (b) Protect groundwater and surface water from contamination by pesticides; and
- (c) Eradicate and control noxious weeds.
