A REGULATION relating to state parks; revising provisions relating to group camping fees; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Section 1. NAC 407.055 is hereby amended to read as follows:

407.055 1. Except as otherwise provided in NAC 407.050 and 407.052, or unless waived, the Division will charge and collect the following fees for the use of parks:

- 2. A person who pays an entrance fee pursuant to subsection 1 is not authorized to use the facilities of the park from 10 p.m. until 6 a.m. unless the person also pays the camping fee for the park.
- 3. Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, the Division will charge and collect from each person who rides a bicycle or horse, walks or enters by vessel into a park an entrance fee of \$1. The Division will charge and collect from each person who rides a bicycle into Spooner Management Area an entrance fee of \$2.
 - 4. The Division will not charge a fee for any vehicle that is towed into a park.
- 5. The Division will charge, in addition to any other fee imposed pursuant to this chapter, a fee of \$2 for each watercraft in excess of two that is launched from a boat ramp.
- 6. If a person purchases an annual permit to a park for a vehicle, the person may purchase at the same time a second annual permit to the same park at a discounted price equal to one-half of the price of the annual permit. The annual permit purchased at a discounted price must be for a vehicle registered to the same owner at the same residence as the owner of the vehicle for which the permit was purchased at regular price.

LEGISLATIVE REVIEW OF ADOPTED REGULATIONS - NRS 233B.066 Informational Statement LCB FILE R007-14

1. A clear and concise explanation of the need for the adopted regulation.

A clerical error inadvertently removed "and camping" from a copy of the full State Parks Fee Schedule during recent consideration of changes to NAC 407.055. The fee schedule was included in the packet approved by the Legislative Commission. Nevada State Parks did not propose or endorse this change. It is the agency's intent to complete the NAC review process by May 14, 2014, in order to comply with the 120-day duration of the emergency regulations.

Clarify the fee term for use of the facilities at Old Las Vegas Mormon Fort State Historic Park from admission fee to museum fee.

Insert the entrance fee waiver for commercial photographer that purchase the Class A Annual Permit, which was based on workshops and hearings done in 2013 process, but was accidently left out of the regulation. This would avoid any additional expenses to small businesses that was never intended.

2. A description of how public comment was solicited, a summary of public response, and an explanation how other interested persons may obtain a copy of the summary.

Copies of the proposed regulations, notices of workshop and notices of intent to act upon the regulation were sent by U.S. mail and emailed to persons who were known to have an interest in the subject of commercial photography as well as any persons who had specifically requested such notice. These documents were also made available at the website of the Division of State Parks, www.parks.nv.gov, website of the Legislative Counsel Bureau, http://leg.state.nv.us/App/Notice/A/, mailed to all county libraries in Nevada and posted at the following locations:

Six photographers attend the hearing in Carson City and no one attended the hearing in Las Vegas. Local newspapers also posted the notice of workshops and hearing in the Legal section of their newspaper.

5. A description of how comment was solicited from affected businesses, a summary of their response, and an explanation how other interested persons may obtain a copy of the summary.

The general public workshop and hearing comment process was open to any business that felt they may be impacted by the regulation changes. Comments were solicited from affected businesses by the notice in the newspapers and by direct mail to interested persons subscribing to the State Park's mailing list. Economic impacts to business as noted in paragraph (c) of subsection 1 of NRS 233B.066 are not anticipated. As an agency we understand the impacts of such regulations are difficult to predict for business that utilize or conduct business with parks. For this reason future regulation changes may be necessary in order to limit any significant impact on business interests. Information regarding the regulations changes are available via email, fax, mail, and listed on our web site.

6. If the regulation was adopted without changing any part of the proposed regulation, a summary of the reasons for adopting the regulation without change.

The emergency changed regulations were adopted on January 15, 2014 and included the clerical error inadvertently removed and all of the changes suggested at the workshops. It is the agency's intent to complete the NAC review process by May 14, 2014, in order to comply with the 120-day duration of the emergency regulation.

- 7. The estimated economic effect of the regulation on the business which it is to regulate and on the public.
 - a. Estimate economic effect on the businesses which they are to regulate:
 - 1) Section #1 no effect on the businesses since this simply reinstates the fees for group camping that were inadvertently removed. Not reinstating them would mean a loss of revenue to the state. Changing the name of the fee from "museum" to "admission" will not have any economic effect.
 - 2) Section #2 if the entrance fee waiver is not inserted for commercial photographers who purchase the Class A, this would create an additional expense for small businesses that was never intended.
 - b. Estimated economic effect on the public which they are to regulate
 - 1) Section #1 no effect on the businesses since this simply reinstates the fees for group camping that were inadvertently removed and the public was already use to paying.
 - 2) Section #2 potential increased use of parks by commercial photographers and their clients.

There is no additional cost to State Parks for the enforcement of the proposed regulations.
