PROPOSED REGULATION OF THE NEVADA INTERSCHOLASTIC ACTIVITIES ASSOCIATION

NAC 386.690 Participation by team that participates in sanctioned sport prohibited; approval of Board regarding preseason and postseason competition; penalty. (NRS 386.430)

- 1. A team that participates in a sanctioned sport shall not engage in any game, contest or meet with an all-star team.
- 2. The Board shall approve each sponsor, participant and guideline relating to any preseason or postseason game, contest or meet in which an all-star team participates during the school year. A school or pupil who is enrolled in a school and who violates a provision of this subsection is subject to suspension or a determination of ineligibility, or both.

NAC 386.691 Approval by Association of competition approved by National Collegiate Athletics Association; submission of written summary of competition. (NRS 386.430)

- 1. The Association may approve any game, contest or meet for an all-star team *which is held during the season of any other sanctioned sport.* [that is approved by the National Collegiate Athletics Association or its successor organization.] To obtain final approval of a game, contest or meet pursuant to this subsection, the director of the game, contest or meet must submit the following to the Association [90 days prior to the game, contest or meet]:
- (a) proof that the entity hosting the game, contest, or meet is a non-profit organization and that all proceeds generated by the game, contest or meet will be used for charitable purposes;
 - (b) a certified check or money order in an amount equal to:
 - (1) [Fifty dollars for each team, if the game, contest or meet is a tournament, or] Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250.00), which constitutes the initial filing fee ninety (90) days prior to the event, and
 - (2) [Five dollars for each person who participates in the game, contest or meet, if the game, contest or meet is not conducted for teams.] Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) if the game, contest or meet receives approval thirty (30) days prior to the event.

- (c) proof of the existence of a comprehensive liability insurance policy insuring the entity or individual sponsoring the game, contest or meet against liability for personal injuries and property damage with general liability limits of \$1,000,000 per claim and \$3,000,000 per occurrence and which names the Association as an additional insured;
- (d) a hold harmless and indemnification agreement agreeing to indemnify and defend the Association against any and all losses associated with the game, contest or meet;
- (e) a roster of participants listing each participant by name, school, grade, and providing signed authorization of a parent or guardian of each participant under the age of 18 allowing participation in the game, contest or meet;
- (f) a statement verifying that participants are not being charged a fee to participate in the game, contest or meet;
- (g) satisfactory proof of compliance with all safety standards applicable to any equipment to be used in the game, contest or meet;
- (h) proof that officials certified to officiate NIAA sanctioned sports will be used to officiate the game, contest or meet;
- (i) proof that the security requirements mandated by the school district where the game, contest or meet is to be held are complied with;
- (j) proof that NCAA requirements regarding amateurism are followed to ensure the continued eligibility of the participants for NCAA eligibility;
- (k) proof that all NIAA Activity Card holders are granted admission to the game, contest or meet free of charge;
- (l) proof that the admission fees charged to view the game, contest or meet will not exceed \$10.00 per person; and

(m) proof that National Athletic Trainers Association trainers will be in attendance at all practices and at the game, contest or meet.

- 2. The Association may restrict the date, time and place of the all-star game, contest or meet to avoid conflicts with other sports sanctioned by the Association. No game, contest or meet will be approved for play on a Sunday in accordance with NAC 386.816.
- 3. The Association may impose reasonable requirements on the director of the all-star game, contest or meet to protect the athletic eligibility, health, safety and welfare of each pupil who participates in the all-star game, contest or meet.

- 4. Not more than 72 hours following completion of an all-star game, contest or meet approved pursuant to subsection 1, the director of the all-star game, contest or meet shall submit to the NIAA a report of any injuries suffered by participants of the all-star game, contest or meet.
- 5. [4.] Not more than [90] 30 days after the completion of an all-star game, contest or meet that is approved pursuant to subsection 1, the director of the all-star game, contest or meet shall submit to the Executive Director a written summary of the all-star game, contest or meet. The written summary must be submitted on a form approved by the Association and must include paid attendance received for the game, contest or meet, and a financial reconciliation report. If the director of the game, contest or meet fails to submit a written summary pursuant to this subsection, the Association may refuse to approve any other all-star game, contest or meet conducted by that director.

[NAC 386.692 Approval by Association of competition when member of all-star team is in 12th grade and is not eligible to participate in sanctioned sport; approval by Board of competition when member of all-star team is graduate of high school. (NRS 386.430)

- 1. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 2, if any member of an all-star team is a pupil who is enrolled in 12th grade in a school and who is not eligible to participate in a sanctioned sport, the Association may approve any game, contest or meet in which the all-star team participates if:
- (a) The National Collegiate Athletics Association, or its successor organization, approves the membership of the pupil on the all-star team, if applicable;
- (b) Any money received from conducting the game, contest or meet is designated for a scholarship or other charitable purpose;
- (c) The school where the game, contest or meet is conducted prohibits the athletic director or principal of the school, or a coach or teacher of the school, from providing assistance for conducting the game, contest or meet unless the school authorizes the athletic director, principal, coach or teacher to use personal leave to provide that assistance;
- (d) Before the game, contest or meet is conducted, the school district in which the game, contest or meet is conducted and the National Federation of State High School Associations, or its successor organization, approve the use of any equipment or facility of the school district for the game, contest or meet; and
- (e) The Board approves each sponsor, if any, for the game, contest or meet.
- 2. The Board shall not approve any game, contest or meet in which an all star team participates if a member of the all-star team has graduated from high school.

[NAC 386.693 Approval by Association of competition when each member of all-star team is eligible to participate in sanctioned sport. (NRS 386.430) If each member of an all-star team is a pupil who is eligible to participate in a sanctioned sport, the Association may approve any game, contest or meet in which the all-star team participates if:

- 1. Before the game, contest or meet is conducted, the National Collegiate Athletics Association or its successor organization and the National Federation of State High School Associations or its successor organization approve the game, contest or meet;
- 2. Any money received from conducting the game, contest or meet is designated for a scholarship or other charitable purpose;
- 3. The game, contest or meet is not held during the reason for any sanctioned sport;
- 4. The school where the game, contest or meet is conducted prohibits the athletic director of principal of the school, or a coach or teacher of the school, from providing assistance for conducting the game, contest or meet unless the school authorizes the athletic director, principal, coach or teacher to use personal leave to provide that assistance;
- 5. Before the game, contest or meet is conducted, the school district in which the game, contest or meet is conducted and the National Federation of State High School Associations, or its successor organization, approve the use of any equipment or facility of the school district for the game, contest or meet; and
- 6. The Board approves each sponsor, if any, for the game, contest or meet.

NAC 386.694 Conditions under which pupil may participate in competition in another state. (NAC 386.430) A pupil who participates in a sanctioned sport may participate in a game, contest or meet for an all-star team that is conducted [in another state] for that sanctioned sport if:

- 1. The pupil is an amateur in the sanctioned sport in accordance with <u>NAC 386.697</u>;
- 2. The game, contest or meet is not held during the season for the sanctioned sport; and

3. [The participation of the pupil in the game, contest or meet does not interfere with his or her ability to participate in any other sanctioned sport.] The principal, athletic director and head coach of any team the pupil is participating on at the time of the all-star game, contest or meet provide written approval for the pupil to participate in the game, contest or meet and notify the Association of such approval.
