# PROPOSED REGULATION OF THE STATE BOARD OF HEALTH

## **LCB File No. R013-14**

### NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

Intent to Adopt Regulations (LCB File No. R013-14)

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the State Board of Health will hold a public hearing to consider amendments to Chapter 432A of Nevada Administrative Code (NAC). This public hearing is to be held in conjunction with the State Board of Health meeting on March 28, 2014. The NAC 432A regulation changes will be heard in the order placed on the State Board of Health agenda.

The State Board of Health will be conducted via videoconference beginning at 9:00 a.m. on Friday, March 28, 2014, at the following locations:

These proposed amendments are needed to comply with the provisions of Assembly Bills 109 and 93 (2013), recently codified in Nevada Revised Statutes (NRS) 432A requiring the Division to develop regulations for the establishment, licensing, operation and regulation of Child Care Licensing (CCL) in the State of Nevada. The proposed regulations address the industry's training qualifications for providers caring for 13 or more children and background by clearly distinguishing definitions of employees and volunteers as well as establishing set guidelines and procedures for providers to ensure timely and mandatory background checks of persons within child care facilities.

In addition, the proposed regulations provide for cleanup of current NAC provisions.

## 1. Anticipated effects on the business which NAC 432A regulates:

A. <u>Adverse effects</u>: In consideration of the responses received from the questionnaire the program has concluded a need for some amendments and further explanation of purpose and method in efforts to be all inclusive and transparent throughout this process.

- Child Care Licensing acknowledges that parent volunteers at facilities should not be subjected to the same requirements as an employee of the facility or a volunteer not utilizing the facility in a parent/patron capacity. Amendment language to be added to exclude parent volunteers needing to receive a background check.
- The increase in child care training hours from 15 annual hours to 24 annual hours has been noted as a significant change, which is why implementation has been planned as a gradual increase over a 3 year span:
  - o January 1, 2014 providers will be expected to complete 18 annual training hours
  - o January 1, 2015 providers will be expected to complete 21 annual training hours
  - January 1, 2016 and on providers will be expected to complete 24 annual training hours
    - It is also important to note that trainings are also made available online through Nevada Registry to help accommodate the increase in training participation. There may also be slight fee adjustments for the added trainings required. The fees applied are per trainers, but are not imposed by the Division.
  - B. <u>Beneficial</u>: These regulations are providing clear guidelines, which include requirements of continued professional training and ensuring timely and proper background checks on persons providing care children within the State of Nevada.
  - C. <u>Immediate</u>: The regulations will allow for the application of this industry progress of promoting professional advancement for the Early Childhood Education needs and bolstering continued risk assessments by taking appropriate security measures.
  - D. <u>Long-term</u>: Provide integrity and professional advancement to the industry and provide child safety by ensuring Nevada's background check process.

#### 2. Anticipated effects on the public:

- A. *Adverse*: None anticipated.
- B. <u>Beneficial</u>: Increased professional understanding of Early Childhood Educational needs and strengthening of safety measures for with children within child cares.
- C. *Immediate*: Increased child safety.
- D. *Long-term*: Increased child safety and Early Childhood Educational needs in training comprehension.
- 3. <u>The estimated cost</u> to the Division of Public and Behavioral Health there is no estimated cost to the agency for enforcement of the proposed regulation as it can be incorporated into the inspection process.

4. <u>Small Business Impact Questionnaires</u> were prepared and on January 10<sup>th</sup>, 2014, the questionnaire was sent with a copy of the proposed regulations to all members of the Division's Child Care Licensing LISTSERV and provider documented emails which contained 492 recipients of Child Care Licensing providers throughout the State of Nevada. Seventy responses were received out of 492 Questionnaires that were distributed.

The Division has determined there is no significant impact on small businesses related to the proposed regulations.

The comments received from the Small Business Impact Questionnaire were taken into consideration with minimal comments received from a Public Workshop that was held on February 11<sup>th</sup>, 2014 with no significant changes which were then turned over to the Legislative Counsel Bureau on February 14<sup>th</sup>, 2014.

The proposed regulations do not overlap or duplicate any other local, state or federal regulations.

The Division is not proposing any new fees or increasing any existing ones

Members of the public may make oral comments at this meeting.
