## APPROVED REGULATION OF THE

## NEVADA INTERSCHOLASTIC ACTIVITIES ASSOCIATION

## LCB File No. R161-16

Effective January 30, 2019

AUTHORITY: §1, NRS 385B.060.

A REGULATION relating to interscholastic activities; revising provisions governing the requirements for a person to be eligible to coach for a school; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

## **Legislative Counsel's Digest:**

Existing law authorizes the formation of the Nevada Interscholastic Activities Association, composed of all of the school districts of the State, for the purposes of controlling, supervising and regulating all interscholastic athletic events and other interscholastic events in the public schools. (NRS 385B.050, 385B.060) Existing law further requires those regulations to provide for the membership in the Association of charter schools, private schools and parochial schools which may elect to join the Association. (NRS 385B.110) Under existing regulations, a person is not eligible to coach for a school unless the person is certified in cardiopulmonary resuscitation and completes certain courses of instruction, or the equivalent of those courses, in: (1) the fundamentals of coaching; (2) first aid, health and safety for coaches; and (3) concussion in sports. (NAC 386.832) This regulation requires any equivalent course to be approved by the Executive Director of the Association. In addition, this regulation requires the course in concussion in sports to be completed at least once every 3 years.

**Section 1.** NAC 386.832 is hereby amended to read as follows:

386.832 *1.* A person is not eligible to coach for a school unless he or she is certified in cardiopulmonary resuscitation and completes the following courses, or the equivalent of those courses [,] *approved by the Executive Director*, offered by the National Federation of State High School Associations or the American Sport Education Program:

- [1.] (a) Fundamentals of Coaching, offered by the National Federation of State High School Associations, or Coaching Principles, offered by the American Sport Education Program;
- [2.] (b) First Aid, Health and Safety for Coaches, offered by the National Federation of State High School Associations, or Sport First Aid, offered by the American Sport Education Program; and
- [3.] (c) Concussion in Sports, offered by the National Federation of State High School Associations.
- 2. To maintain his or her eligibility to coach for a school, a person must complete the course specified in paragraph (c) of subsection 1 at least once every 3 years after the person begins his or her employment as a coach for a school.
