# ADOPTED TEMPORARY REGULATION OF THE STATE CONTRACTORS BOARD

**Section 1.** NAC 624.136 is hereby amended to read as follows:

NAC 624.136 Criminal investigator: Qualifications. (NRS 624.100, 624.112) Each person who is employed by the Board as a criminal investigator [must]:

- 1. *May be required to* [H] *h*old valid certification as a peace officer by the Peace Officers' Standards and Training Commission pursuant to chapter 289 of NRS; and
  - 2. **Shall** | have one of the following:
- (a) A high school diploma and have at least 5 years of experience in law enforcement or criminal investigations, or equivalent experience, as determined by the Board;
- (b) A bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university with a major in criminal justice, law enforcement, or a related area of study as determined by the Board, and have at least 4 years of experience in law enforcement or criminal investigations, or equivalent experience, as determined by the Board; or
  - (c) Any sufficient combination of education and experience as determined by the Board. (Added to NAC by Contractors' Bd. by R061-01, eff. 11-20-2001)

# INFORMATIONAL STATEMENT OF ADOPTED TEMPORARY REGULATION AS REQUIRED BY ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEDURES ACT, NRS 233B.066 LCB FILE NO. T008-16

The following statement is submitted for adopted amendments to the Nevada Administrative Code (NAC) Chapter 624 in compliance with NRS 233B.066.

1. A clear and concise explanation of the need for the adopted regulation.

The purpose of proposed temporary regulation is to amend Chapter 624 of the Nevada Administrative Code concerning the qualifications of persons employed by the Board as criminal investigators. The proposed change amends the language of NAC 624.136(1) regarding certification as a peace officer by the Peace Officers' Standards and Training Commission from a mandatory requirement to a discretionary requirement. The proposed change would provide the agency with enhanced recruiting capabilities and allow for more effective use of manpower.

The temporary regulation was adopted without changing any part of the proposed regulation since no public comment was received at the workshop or hearing.
