NOTICE OF INTENT TO ACT UPON A REGULATION

Notice of Workshop and Hearing for the Adoption, Amendment or Repeal of Regulations of

The State of Nevada Contractors Board

The State of Nevada Contractors Board (Board) will conduct a public workshop on Friday November 18, 2016 at 9:00 a.m. and a public hearing on Tuesday December 6, 2016 at 9:00 a.m. The workshop and hearing will be video-conferenced between the Board's Henderson office located at 2310 Corporate Circle, Suite 200, Henderson, Nevada 89074 and the Reno office located at 9670 Gateway Drive, Suite 100, Reno, Nevada, 89521.

The following information is provided pursuant to the requirements of NRS 233B.060 and 233B.0603:

1. The need for and purpose of the proposed regulation or amendment.

The purpose of proposed regulation is to amend Chapter 624 of the Nevada Administrative Code concerning the qualifications of persons employed by the Board as criminal investigators. The proposed change amends the language of NAC 624.136(1) regarding certification as a peace officer by the Peace Officers' Standards and Training Commission from a mandatory requirement to a discretionary requirement.

2. Either the terms or the substance of the regulations to be adopted, amended or repealed or a description of the subjects and issues involved.

The proposed regulation changes NAC 624.136(1) from a mandatory provision to a discretionary provision. A copy of the proposed regulation may be obtained by visiting our website at www.nscb.nv.gov or writing to the Board's offices.

3. The estimated economic effect of this proposed regulation on the business which it is to regulate and on the public.

(a) Adverse and beneficial effects.

The proposed regulation should not result in any economic impact as it does not change or modify contractor licensure requirements. The regulation should not result in any adverse economic effect on the general public.

(b) Both immediate and long-term effects.

The immediate and long term effect of implementing the provisions of the proposed regulation would provide the agency with enhanced recruiting capabilities and will allow for more effective use of manpower.

- 4. The estimated cost to the agency for the enforcement of the proposed regulation. The proposed regulation will not result in any cost to the agency.
- 5. A description of and citation to any regulations of other states or local governmental agencies which the proposed regulation overlaps or duplicates and a statement explaining why the duplication and overlapping is necessary.

If no person who is directly affected by the proposed action appears to request time to make an oral presentation, the board may proceed immediately to act upon any written submissions.

Copies of this notice and the proposed regulation will also be mailed to members of the public upon request. A reasonable fee may be charged for copies if deemed necessary.

Upon adoption of any regulation, the board, if requested to do so by an interested person, either before adoption or within 30 days thereafter, shall issue a concise statement of the principal reasons for and against its adoption and incorporate therein its reason for overruling the consideration urged against its adoption.

EXPLANATION – Matter in *italics* is new; matter in brackets \vdash is material to be omitted.

Section 1. NAC 624.136 is hereby amended to read as follows:

NAC 624.136 Criminal investigator: Qualifications. (NRS 624.100, 624.112) Each person who is employed by the Board as a criminal investigator [must]:

- 1. *May be required to* [H] hold valid certification as a peace officer by the Peace Officers' Standards and Training Commission pursuant to chapter 289 of NRS; and
 - 2. **Shall** \biguplus have one of the following:
- (a) A high school diploma and have at least 5 years of experience in law enforcement or criminal investigations, or equivalent experience, as determined by the Board;
- (b) A bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university with a major in criminal justice, law enforcement, or a related area of study as determined by the Board, and have at least 4 years of experience in law enforcement or criminal investigations, or equivalent experience, as determined by the Board; or
 - (c) Any sufficient combination of education and experience as determined by the Board.
