INFORMATIONAL STATEMENT OF ADOPTED REGULATION AS REQUIRED BY ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEDURES ACT, NRS 2338.066 LCB FILE NO. R042-17

The following statement is submitted for adopted amendments to the Nevada Administrative Code (NAC) Chapter 624 in compliance with NRS 2338.066.

1. A clear and concise explanation of the need for the adopted regulation.

The proposed regulation is the result of SB 69 passed during the 2017 Legislative session which requires the agency to adopt regulations which provide for licensure by endorsement.

The proposed regulation requires the Board to determine if the requirements for licensing a contractor inanother state or territory are substantially equivalent to those in Nevada, and further authorizes the Board, under certain circumstances, to endorse the experience qualifications of an applicant licensed in that, state and recognize examinations from other states or an accredited by the National Association of State Contractors Licensing Agencies when those examinations are determined to be substantially equivalent to Nevada's state examination. The regulation also requires the Board to deem an application withdrawn if the Board has not received with in 6 months after the date the application was submitted to the Board all the information required to complete an application, and makes conforming changes related to submittal of fingerprints.

2. A description of how public comment was solicited, a summary of the public response and an explanation of how other interested persons may obtain a copy of the summary.

The notice of workshop and notice of hearing to solicit comments on the proposed regulation was posted at various public locations, on the agency's website and on the Nevada Public Notice Website. Additionally the notice of workshop and hearing, and the proposed regulation were mailed to approximately 378 individuals and organizations on the agency's mailing list to receive notice of regulation hearings.

The agency received no public comment concerning the proposed regulation.

Additionally the notice or workshop and hearing, and the proposed regulation were mailed to approximately 378 individuals and organizations on the agency's mailing list to receive notice of regulation hearings. No written or verbal comments were received.

The regulation was adopted without changing any part of the proposed regulation since no public comment was received at the workshop or hearing and no written comments were received by the agency.

- 7. The estimated economic effect of the regulation on the business which it is to regulate and on the public.
 - A) Estimated economic effect on the businesses which they are to regulate.

The proposed regulation should not result in any adverse economic impact as it does not establish any additional requirements for businesses seeking licensure. The proposed regulation may have a favorable economic impact on certain applicants seeking licensure as it provides for licensure by endorsement under certain circumstances. The immediate and long term effect of the proposed regulation may be to increase the number of contractors from other states who seek opportunities to work in Nevada.

B) Estimated economic effect on the public which they are to regulate

The proposed regulation should not result in any adverse economic effect on the general public. The proposed regulation may have a favorable economic impact as it may encourage out of state contractors to seek licensure in Nevada providing the public with additional resources.

The immediate and long term effect of the proposed regulation may be to encourage out of state contractors to seek licensure in Nevada providing the public with additional resources.
