Regulation 389XXX

Effective , a student in Nevada is no longer required to pass the High School Proficiency Examinations to receive a standard high school diploma.

Any student denied a standard high school diploma on or after May 1, 2012, solely because the student did not satisfy any existing requirement to pass the High School Proficiency Examinations will be issued a standard high school diploma if:

- (1) The student submits to the school district or charter school in which the student was last enrolled in high school a written request for a determination of whether the student, notwithstanding the failure of the student to satisfy any existing requirement to pass the High School Proficiency Examinations, otherwise satisfied any existing requirements to receive a standard high school diploma; and
- (2) After reviewing the transcript of the student and any other relevant documentation, the school district or charter school determines that, notwithstanding the failure of the student to satisfy any existing requirement to pass the High School Proficiency Examinations, the student otherwise satisfied any existing requirements to receive a Standard High School Diploma.
