## LEGISLATIVE REVIEW OF ADOPTED REGULATIONS—NRS 233B.066 Informational Statement LCB File No. R117-17

Prescribes the required content in a request that the Superintendent of Public Instruction determine whether a provider of special education is in compliance with laws and regulations governing the education of pupils with disabilities in Nevada.

Lindsay Anderson, Washoe County School District, commented on two items in the legal language. In section 2 (a), it specifics whether the request provides enough information to determine whether the alleged violation occurred. Washoe County School District hesitated to support this bill during the 2017 Legislative Session because of the lack of clarity regarding how that determination would be made. The school district was hopeful that there would be guidelines in the regulation to help determine whether or not the alleged violation was frivolous or legitimate. There are still no guidelines the districts can use. If they are not going to be in the regulation, will there be further guidance to districts about how the superintendent will determine whether or not these accusations are legitimate and need to be moved on.

In the same section 2, subsection (b) it refers to the dates on which the alleged violation occurred. Ms. Anderson inquired whether there is a time limitation for filing the complaints. State complaints must be filed within one year and she recommended a one year limitation to file for this process as well
