PROPOSED REGULATION OF THE

BOARD OF WILDLIFE COMMISSIONERS

EXPLANATION - Matter in italics is new; matter in brackets [omitted material] is material to be omitted.

AUTHORITY: §1, NRS 501.105, 501.181 and 503.150.

A REGULATION relating to hunting; removing the prohibition against using a shotgun which is smaller than 20 gauge to hunt wild turkey; removing the prohibition against using shot which is larger than standard-size T to hunt wild turkey on a wildlife management area; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

Existing law requires the Board of Wildlife Commissioners to adopt regulations which are necessary to: (1) preserve, protect, manage and restore wildlife and its habitat in this State; and (2) carry out the provisions of title 45 of NRS governing wildlife, including the manner and means of taking wildlife. (NRS 501.105 and 501.181) Existing law makes it unlawful to hunt any game bird or game mammal with a shotgun larger than number 10 gauge, unless otherwise specified in a regulation adopted by the Commission. (NRS 503.150)

Existing regulations prohibit the use of: (1) a shotgun smaller than 20 gauge to hunt wild turkey; and (2) shot which is larger than standard-size T to hunt wild turkey on a wildlife management area. (NAC 503.187) This regulation removes both of those prohibitions.

- **Section 1.** NAC 503.187 is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 503.187 1. No weapon other than a:
- (a) Shotgun which is no larger than *number* 10 gauge [nor smaller than 20 gauge] and uses a shot size no larger than a number 2 pellet; or
 - (b) Bow and arrow,
- → may be used to hunt wild turkey.
 - 2. Shot used to hunt wild turkey on a wildlife management area must be \(\frac{1}{4}\):

- (a) Nontoxic shot; and
- (b) Not larger than standard-size T.] nontoxic.
