

LEGISLATIVE REVIEW OF ADOPTED REGULATIONS--NRS 233B.066
Informational Statement
LCB File No. R006-19

1. A clear and concise explanation of the need for the adopted regulation.

Existing law requires the Peace Officer Standards and Training Commission to adopt regulations establishing minimum standards for the certification and decertification, recruitment, selection and training of peace officers. (NRS 289.510) (NAC 289.290) Existing law also requires the Commission to suspend, revoke or deny a Basic Certification of a peace officer for convictions of Felonies, Gross Misdemeanors and Misdemeanors.

However, misdemeanor convictions requires the agency to recommend the Commission to take action. R006-19 will provide the Commission with authority to suspend or revoke a peace officer's certification upon conviction for a misdemeanor crime of domestic violence as defined in 18 U.S.C. §921 (a)(33) without the recommendation of the employing agency.
