LEGISLATIVE REVIEW OF ADOPTED PERMANENT REGULATIONS AS REQUIRED BY NRS 233B.066

LCB FILE R109-19

The following statement is submitted for adopted amendments to Nevada Administrative code (NAC) Chapter 612.

1. A clear and concise explanation of the need for the adopted regulation.

This regulation will add a requirement to the Veterans and Senior Citizens Small Business Loan program stating that financial institutions entering into a contract to disburse a grant of money pursuant to the program shall distribute the funds within 15 months of the date on which the application for the grant submitted by the nonprofit private entity is approved. This regulation is needed due to standard bank lending practices making it untenable for the awarded party to implement any program or report on any program activity under previous timelines.

2. A description of how public comment was solicited, a summary of public response, and an explanation how other interested persons may obtain a copy of the summary.

In compliance with NRS 233B.0603, a Small Business Workshop was held on Thursday, December 5 at 10:00 a.m., the live meeting was held at the Legislative Building, 401 S. Carson Street, Room 3137, Carson City, Nevada 89701 and Video conferenced to the Grant Sawyer Building, 555 E. Washington Ave, Room 4401, Las Vegas, Nevada 89101. The purpose of the Small Business Workshop was to solicit public comment on a proposed regulation requiring that Grant Funds for the Veterans and Senior Citizens Small Business Start-up Loan Program established pursuant to NAC 612.673 be distributed to the recipient within 15 months of approval.

Notice of the Small Business Workshop was sent on November 19, 2019, requesting comments by December 2, 2019, to all individuals and employers on the Employment Security Division mailing list. Notices were posted at the principal office of the Employment Security Division in Carson City, as well as numerous offices of the Employment Security Division throughout the state. In addition, the notices were submitted to the Legislative Counsel Bureau, the Nevada State Library, and all main county libraries in the state. During the Small Business Workshop, the Administrator of ESD reviewed the language and purpose of the proposed regulation for the public. The final draft of the regulation was drafted by LCB on February 4, 2020.

On February 11, 2020, the Division issued a Hearing Agenda and a Notice of Intent to Act upon the proposed regulation. The Notice and Agenda was sent by mail or email, to all individuals and employers on the Employment Security Division mailing list. The Notice and Agenda was posted at the principal office of the Employment Security Division in Carson City, as well as numerous offices of the Employment Security Division throughout the state. In addition, the notice was submitted to the Legislative Counsel Bureau, the Nevada State Library, and all main county libraries in the state, including all locations in the

The division posted the regulation drafted by LCB to the DETR website and posted the revised language to the Nevada Legislature website. A copy of the regulation was also made available to the public at the Hearing and the ESD Administrator reviewed the Amended Regulation, providing an explanation of the Regulation.

In compliance with NRS 233B, a Hearing for the adoption of the regulation was held on March 13, 2020 at 10:00 a.m., the live meeting was held at the DETR – SAO Auditorium, 500 E 3rd St, Carson City, Nevada 89713 and Video conferenced to DETR – St. Louis Conference Room C, 2800 E. St. Louis Ave, Las Vegas, Nevada 89104. The purpose of the hearing was to receive comments from all interested persons regarding the adoption of the regulation pertaining to Chapter 612, of the Nevada Administrative Code.

Comments were solicited from affected businesses in the same manner as they were solicited from the public.

No recommended changes submitted in written or public comment.

This regulation change will add a requirement to the Veterans and Senior Citizens Small Business Loan program stating that institutions entering into a contract to disburse a grant of money pursuant to the program shall distribute the funds within 15 months of the date on which the application for the grant is approved.

Beneficial Impacts

This regulation change will allow for more reliable distribution of grant funds and reporting on program outcome measures.

Adverse Impacts

There is estimated to be no adverse impact from this regulation change.

Direct Impacts

The direct impact of this regulation will be adding a requirement that grant funds are distributed to recipients within 15 months of approval.

Indirect Impacts

DETR anticipates an improvement in the reporting of program outcome measures due to the shortened distribution timeframe.

Immediate Effect:

The immediate impact of this regulation will be an addition of a requirement for grant funds to be issued pursuant to the Veterans and Senior Citizens Small Business Loan program within 15 months after the approval of the grant.

Long-Term Effect:

By requiring that funds for the Veterans and Small Business Loan program be distributed within 15 months of the date the award was approved, the awarded party will be better able to implement programs and report on program activity, which was untenable due to standard bank lending practices prior to the passing of this regulation.

7. The estimated cost to the agency for enforcement of the adopted regulation.

This regulation will not require enforcement and therefore there is estimated to be no cost related to enforcement.

Anticipated Revenue Increase and Use

There is no anticipated change in revenue increase or use.

8. A description of any regulations of other state or government agencies which the proposed regulation overlaps or duplicates and a statement explaining why the duplication or overlapping is necessary. If the regulation overlaps or duplicates a federal regulation, the name of the regulating federal agency.

This regulation does not overlap or duplicate any other regulation of federal, state, or local governments.

The proposed regulation is not required pursuant to federal law, nor is there a federal regulation that regulates the same activity.

This Regulation does not impose any new or increased fees on employers.
