1. A clear and concise explanation of the need for the adopted regulation:

NRS Chapter 289 authorizes the Commission to adopt regulations setting the minimum standards for the certification, decertification, training and selection of peace officers. See NRS 289.510. The existing regulations establish the minimum standards of training for certain category I, category II, category III, and reserve peace officer. (NAC 289.140-170)

NRS 289.510 requires a peace officer to satisfy certain requirements annually in order to maintain a basic certificate or reserve certificate, including completion of 12 hours of in-service training prescribed by the administrator of the employing agency of the peace officer. Existing regulations authorize this in-service training to include, without limitation, training related to: (1) legal issues; (2) the policies and procedures of the employing agency of the peace officer; (3) driving; (4) first aid; (5) cardiopulmonary resuscitation; (6) blood-borne pathogens; (7) sexual harassment; and (8) any other training prescribed by the administrator of the employing agency of the peace officer. (NAC 289.230) Section 1 of this regulation removes the existing in-service training requirements and instead provides that the peace officer must complete not less than 12 hours of continuing education in courses that address: (1) racial profiling; (2) mental health (3) the well-being of officers; (4) implicit bias recognition; (5) de-escalation; (6) human trafficking; and (7) firearms. Sections 2 and 3 of this regulation make conforming changes.
