R168-20

1. A clear and concise explanation of the need for the adopted regulation:

NRS Chapter 289 authorizes the Commission to adopt regulations establishing minimum standards for the certification and decertification, recruitment, selection and training of peace officers. (NRS 289.510)

Existing regulations authorize the Executive Director of the Commission to award a basic certificate to a peace officer who meets the minimum standards of appointment and has been certified by another state or completed certain federal training approved by the Commission if the peace officer meets certain requirements. Existing regulations require such a peace officer to pass the state physical fitness examination not later than 16 weeks after: (1) the date on which the peace officer was hired; or (2) if the peace officer is a reserve officer, the date of activation of his or her reserve status.

(NAC 289.200(4)(b)) This regulation additionally requires such a peace officer to pass the state physical fitness examination not sooner than 30 days before the date on which the peace officer was hired and not later than 16 weeks after (1) The date on which the officer was hired; or (2) If the officer is a reserve officer, the date of activation of his or her reserve status.

This regulation eliminates the need to administer the physical fitness test multiple times during the hiring process, therefore saving the law enforcement agencies time and money.
