# LCB FILE NO. R050-21 Commission General Regulation 501

The following statement is submitted for adopted amendments to Nevada Administrative Code (NAC) Chapter 502.

## 1. A clear and concise explanation of the need for the adopted regulation:

Assembly Bill 89 out of the 81st Legislative Session gave the Board of Wildlife Commission the authority to create a program that allows for the transference of a big game tag from an individual to a qualified organization who provides hunting opportunities to select individuals. It also allows for the ability to transfer a big game tag from a tag holder who is deceased to another eligible individual. The regulation changes the timeline when allowing for a deferral. The included regulation change creates that process.

Public comment was solicited during one regulation workshop of the Nevada Board of Wildlife Commissioners (NBWC) in May 2022, as well as during the adoption hearing in June 2022.

This regulation does not have an anticipated immediate or long-term economic effect on the public.
