#### INFORMATIONAL STATEMENT

### Nevada Board of Funeral & Cemetery Services LCB File No. R142-23

The following information is provided pursuant to NRS 233B.066 regarding adopted amendments to Nevada Administrative Code Chapter 451:

1. A clear and concise explanation of the need for the adopted regulation.

Pursuant to Nevada Governor Joe Lombardo's Executive Order 2023-003, the Nevada Funeral and Cemetery Services Board (Board) conducted a comprehensive review of the regulations subject to the Board's enforcement. Pursuant to that Executive Order, the Board identified certain provisions of NAC 642 that duplicated provisions of Nevada Revised Statutes, specifically NRS Chapter 233B.

An additional proposed amendment is offered as guidance for compliance with NRS Chapter 451 as amended by Assembly Bill 289 (2023) regarding natural organic reduction.

2. A description of how public comment was solicited, a summary of public response, and an explanation of how other interested persons may obtain a copy of the summary.

The Board solicited public comment by emailing the proposed regulation, notice of workshop, notice of intent to act upon the regulation, and small business impact statement to persons who were known to have an interest in the Nevada Funeral and Cemetery Services Board regulation of funeral and cemetery services, specifically individuals and business entities holding an active license issued by the Board, as well as any person who had specifically requested such notice. These documents were also made available at the following locations:

On November 15, 2023, the Board held a workshop to solicit comments on the proposed regulations. There were 16 individuals from the public in attendance at the workshop. Thereafter, on or about April 8, 2025, a Notice of Intent to Action Upon Regulations was issued. On May 14, 2025, the Board held a public hearing. There were no written or oral public comments presented at the hearing. There were 24 individual members of the public present at the hearing.

The Board discussed the regulatory changes during a public workshop on November 15, 2023. The workshop was open to the public, including representatives of any business that may be impacted by the regulation. There were no public comments in opposition to any of the changes or regarding any economic impact on small businesses.

On May 15, 2025, the Board held a public hearing regarding adoption of the proposed regulation. There were no public comments submitted at this hearing. In addition, there were no comments regarding the proposed changes or any economic impact on small businesses.

The Board adopted the regulation on May 14, 2025, with no changes, as there were no comments or suggested changes submitted in writing or during the hearing.

The Board determined that the regulation would have no adverse economic impact on businesses it regulates or the public.

Any immediate or long-term economic impact would be in the improved efficiency of the Board's regulatory activities due to clarification of existing law.
