AUTHORITY: NRS 624.100(1); NRS 624.220

A REGULATION requiring, under certain circumstances, the State Contractors' Board to issue licenses by endorsement or provisional licenses to certain persons to perform work on attainable housing projects in certain rural areas

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

Existing law provides for the licensure and regulation of contractors by the State Contractors' Board.

Sec. 1. NAC 624 is hereby amended by adding a new section to read as follows:

CONTRACTOR'S LICENSE BY ENDORSEMENT: *The Board may issue a Contractor's License by Endorsement to qualified applicants who may only perform work related to attainable housing projects in rural areas of the State. The licensee may not perform any other work in this State unless they obtain a contractor's license issued by the State Contractors Board.*

A Contractor's License by Endorsement expires on December 31, 2029.

PROVISIONAL CONTRACTOR'S LICENSE: *The Board may issue a Provisional Contractor's License for work related to an attainable housing project in the rural area of the State as described in the declaration from the Director of the Department of Business and Industry.*

A person holding a Provisional Contractor's License may submit bids for, or enter into contracts to perform, work on attainable housing projects in such rural areas where a contractor's license is required. The licensee may not perform any other work in this State for which a contractor's license is required unless they obtain a contractor's license issued by the State Contractors Board.

A Provisional Contractor's License expires on December 31, 2029.
