Concept Language – Open Enrollment and Transportation Updated 10/15/25



NAC 388.XXX Review and approval of programs for open enrollment

- 1.Effective May 1, 2026, school districts must submit an application packet to the Department for a system of open enrollment, to include copies of all policies and procedures per NRS 388, applications, guidance, and internal desk manuals, for review and approval.
- 2. After initial approval, districts are required to submit such an application to the Department only if a change has been made to the policies and procedures or application.
- 3. The Department shall evaluate these materials for compliance and best practices pursuant to publicly available rubrics, providing their approval and evaluation score within 30 days of receipt.

NAC 388.XXX Prioritization of students under a system of open enrollment

- 1. When receiving new applications under a system of open enrollment, Districts must provide the following priority placement of students
 - (1) Students that live in the zone of attendance of a one- or two-star school, and
 - (2) any other preference or priority as established by the district
 - (i) districts may elect to use a lottery system for applicants pursuant to section (a)(2), or in the event there is not capacity to place all students requesting placement in (a)(1).

NAC 388.XXX Determining Capacity

- 1. For the purposes of calculating school capacity, districts must assess:
 - (a) the total number of instructional teaching stations at the school site
 - (b) the total number of seats available per instructional teaching station pursuant to building occupancy, with consideration of the student-teacher ratio for the course, dependent upon grade level, subject matter, and the support of instructional aides and instructional support personnel.

NAC 388.XXX Teaching Station defined

A teaching station is defined as a distinct location designed for a group of students to engage in a specific learning task facilitated by a teacher or instructional support personnel.

NAC 387.XXX Award of grants; application to receive grant; prioritization of award of grants.

- 1. The Department shall, to the extent money is available, award grants of money to school districts to support transportation to attend a public school located outside the zone of attendance that the pupil is otherwise required to attend. Each district supported by a grant awarded pursuant to this section must:
 - (a) Responsive to responses from a family engagement survey regarding the transportation mechanism that would best serve families, to include ensuring support for children with disabilities, do one or more of the following:
 - (1) enter into agreements with transportation providers to provide services to students; (2) Develop a community program to provide transportation services to students; or (3) create a system of individual reimbursement to families.
 - (b) Develop a mechanism for families to apply for transportation support
 - (c) have an approved system of open enrollment in place
- 2. A school district that wishes to receive a grant pursuant to this section must submit an application to the Department. The Department may approve such an application if the Department determines that the application:
 - (a) Includes an implementation plan which is financially sound;
 - (b) Is responsive to the needs identified by families and provides the broadest system of supports feasible
 - (c) includes a count of students estimated to request transportation services, and an estimated cost per student for the provision of such services

- (d) includes a count of students in each tier of eligibility/priority as follows:
 - (1) Students that live in the zone of attendance of a one- or two-star school and are direct certified FRL, homeless, migrant, or foster care
 - (2) students that live in the zone of attendance of public school, regardless of star rating, who are direct certified FRL, homeless, migrant, or foster care
 - (3) a student that lives in the zone of attendance of a one- or two-star school that is designated FRL
 - (4) a student that lives in the zone of attendance of a public school, regardless of star rating, that is designated FRL
 - (5) as funding is available, any other students
 - (i) in the event funding is not available for all students in a tier, transportation funding should be allocated in the order of application received.
- 3. The Department shall prioritize the award of grants pursuant to the tiered priority of students in section (2).
