

**PROPOSED REGULATION OF THE
STATE BOARD OF HEALTH**

AUTHORITY: §§ 1 and 2, NRS 450B.120.

A REGULATION relating to emergency medical services; revising provisions relating to an endorsement as an instructor in emergency medical services; revising provisions relating to the requirements for the renewal of an endorsement as an instructor in emergency medical services; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel’s Digest:

Existing law requires the State Board of Health to establish and promulgate such rules, regulations, standards and procedures as it determines are necessary to administer the provisions of existing law concerning emergency medical services. (NRS 450B.120) Existing regulations establish requirements for an applicant to receive an endorsement as an instructor in emergency medical services. (450B.723) **Section 1** of this regulation revises these requirements by requiring an applicant to provide proof that the applicant has successfully completed a course in emergency medical services instructor training within the immediately preceding 2 years.

Existing regulations authorize a physician, physician assistant or registered nurse who is not certified as an instructor to teach a program of training in emergency medical services if approved by the Division of Public and Behavioral Health of the Department of Human Services. (NAC 450B.723) **Section 1** authorizes an emergency medical services registered nurse, rather than a registered nurse, who is not certified as an instructor to teach a program of training in emergency medical services if approved by the Division.

Existing regulations establish requirements for renewing an endorsement as an instructor in emergency medical services. Specifically, existing regulations provide that an endorsement is renewable if, in addition to certain other requirements, the holder of the endorsement verifies participation as an instructor in 10 hours of emergency medical training. (NAC 450B.725) **Section 2** of this regulation revises this requirement by instead requiring the holder of the endorsement to participate as an instructor in 10 hours of any of the following trainings that are approved by the Division: (1) an initial training course; (2) a refresher course; or (3) a course in which a person may earn continuing education units. **Section 2** also prohibits certain types of training from being used to satisfy such training requirements.

Section 1. NAC 450B.723 is hereby amended to read as follows:

450B.723 1. To receive an endorsement as an instructor in emergency medical services, an applicant must pay a fee in the amount prescribed in NAC 450B.700 and provide:

(a) Proof ~~{of the successful completion of}~~ *that, within the immediately preceding 2 years, the applicant has successfully completed* a course or courses in training equivalent to the national standard prepared by the National Association of EMS Educators as a national standard for instructors or an equivalent standard approved by the Administrator of the Division and verification of current certification as an emergency medical dispatcher, emergency medical responder, emergency medical technician, advanced emergency medical technician or paramedic issued by the Division; or

(b) Proof that the applicant holds current certification as a Fire Service Instructor II, as described in *Nevada Fire Service Professional Qualifications*, available free of charge from the Nevada State Fire Marshal at the Internet address http://fire.nv.gov/bureaus/FST/Training_Manuals/.

2. A person certified as an instructor in emergency medical services may teach a program of training in emergency medical services less than or equal to the level of the instructor's emergency medical certification but may not teach outside ~~{of}~~ the scope of the level of instruction indicated by the national standard prepared by the National Association of EMS Educators as a national standard for instructors or an equivalent standard approved by the Administrator of the Division.

3. A physician, physician assistant or *emergency medical services* registered nurse who is not certified as an instructor may teach a program of training in emergency medical services if approved by the Division.

4. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 3, the Division shall impose against a person who serves as an instructor without a valid endorsement an administrative penalty of:

- (a) For instruction provided on or after January 27, 2017, and before July 1, 2018, \$200;
- (b) For instruction provided on or after July 1, 2018, and before July 1, 2019, \$250; and
- (c) For instruction provided on or after July 1, 2019, \$300.

Sec. 2. NAC 450B.725 is hereby amended to read as follows:

450B.725 1. An endorsement ~~to be~~ *as an instructor in emergency medical services for an emergency medical dispatcher, emergency medical responder, emergency medical technician, advanced emergency medical technician or paramedic* expires on the date of expiration appearing on the certificate ~~for an emergency medical dispatcher, emergency medical responder, emergency medical technician, advanced emergency medical technician or paramedic.~~ *of the holder.*

2. ~~The~~ *Except as otherwise provided in subsection 3, the* endorsement is renewable if the holder of the endorsement verifies participation as an instructor in 10 hours of ~~emergency medical~~ training *in an initial training course, a refresher course or a course in which a person may earn continuing education credits, that is approved by the Division,* within the 2 years immediately preceding the expiration date of the endorsement and pays ~~a~~ *the* fee ~~in the amount~~ prescribed ~~in~~ *by* NAC 450B.700.

3. *The Division shall not accept completion of the following types of training for the purposes of satisfying the requirements of subsection 2:*

- (a) Training in basic life support or the administration of cardiopulmonary resuscitation;*
- (b) A verification of skills completed pursuant to subsection 2 of NAC 450B.380;*
- (c) Any training completed outside of this State; and*

(d) Any other training that is not approved by the Division.
