

**PROPOSED REGULATION OF THE
STATE BOARD OF HEALTH**

AUTHORITY: § 1, NRS 450B.120; § 2, NRS 439.150, 450B.120, 450B.155 and 450B.200.

A REGULATION relating to emergency medical services; requiring the host organization for a special event to submit to the Division of Public and Behavioral Health of the Department of Human Services for approval an application and detailed plan for the provision of emergency medical care at the special event; establishing and revising certain fees the Division may charge for credentials and services regulated by the Division; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel’s Digest:

Existing law requires the district board of health or the State Board of Health, as applicable, to promulgate such regulations as it determines are necessary to administer the provisions of existing law relating to emergency medical services. (NRS 450B.120) Existing law also establishes requirements for the provision of emergency medical services at certain special events. (NRS 450B.650-450B.700) Not less than 30 days before the date on which such a special event is scheduled to take place, **section 1** of this regulation requires the host organization for the special event to submit to the Division of Public and Behavioral Health of the Department of Human Services for approval an application which must include a detailed plan for the provision of emergency medical care at the special event. **Section 1** authorizes the Division to: (1) approve, deny or require modifications to such an application; (2) impose conditions on the approval of such an application as necessary to ensure public safety; and (3) revoke the approval of such an application under certain circumstances. Before the date on which the special event is scheduled to take place, **section 1** authorizes the Division to conduct an inspection of the site of the special event to verify that the site is in compliance with the application and plan for the provision of emergency medical care approved by the Division. If there is a material change to any of the information submitted by the host organization, **section 1** requires the host organization to timely notify the Division and submit a revised application to the Division for approval. **Section 1** prohibits a host organization from conducting a special event unless the Division has approved and not revoked its approval of the required application.

Existing law authorizes and requires the Board to establish reasonable fees for certain credentials and services which are regulated by the Division. (NRS 439.150, 450B.155, 450B.200) **Section 2** of this regulation establishes certain fees that the Division may charge for: (1) expediting the processing of certain credentials; (2) the review of an application and plan for

the provision of emergency medical care at a special event; (3) an inspection of the site of a special event; and (4) certain research required by staff of the Division, including compiling data files for requested information. **Section 2** also revises certain existing fees for credentials and services regulated by the Division.

Section 1. Chapter 450B of NAC is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to read as follows:

1. Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, not less than 30 days before the date on which a special event is scheduled to take place, the host organization shall submit to the Division an application that satisfies the requirements of subsection 2 and the fee for the review of an application and plan for the provision of emergency medical care at the special event prescribed in NAC 450B.700. The host organization may submit the application and fee on a date which is less than 30 days before the date on which the special event is scheduled to take place if the host organization has submitted to the Division a request to do so and the Division has approved the request.

2. The application required pursuant to subsection 1 must be on a form prescribed by the Division and include, without limitation:

(a) The name and contact information of the host organization and a natural person who will be responsible for the special event;

(b) The date, time and location of the special event;

(c) The number of persons who are expected to attend the special event; and

(d) A detailed plan for the provision of emergency medical care at the special event, which must include, without limitation:

(1) The identity of any person who is designated to oversee the provision of emergency medical care at the special event, if applicable, including, without limitation, a medical director or physician;

(2) The number of licensees or other personnel who will be present at the site of the special event and available to provide emergency care;

(3) The level of licensure or certification held by each person described in subparagraphs (1) and (2);

(4) Methods and procedures that the persons described in subparagraphs (1) and (2) will use to:

(I) Triage, treat and transport patients at the special event; and

(II) Communicate, including, without limitation, with dispatchers and any facility to which a patient is transported from the special event;

(5) An overall plan of the site of the special event that includes, without limitation, routes of ingress and egress for emergency vehicles, access points, staging areas and the locations of medical resources;

(6) The number of first-aid stations, if applicable, which the host organization will provide at the site of the special event, including, without limitation, the type and location of each first-aid station;

(7) The number of roving emergency medical technician teams and roving intermediate emergency medical technician teams, if applicable, which the host organization will provide at the site of the special event;

(8) The number of ambulances and dedicated advanced life support ambulances, if applicable, which the host organization will provide at the site of the special event; and

(9) Any other information required by the Division to ensure compliance with the provisions of NRS 450B.650 to 450B.700, inclusive.

3. Upon receipt of a completed application which includes the information required by subsection 2 and payment of the fee required by NAC 450B.700, the Division will:

(a) Review the application to:

(1) Determine whether the plan for the provision of emergency medical care at the special event meets the requirements of NRS 450B.650 to 450B.700, inclusive; and

(2) Evaluate any risks which may be associated with the special event, including, without limitation, environmental conditions, the type of event, the number of persons who are expected to attend the event and historical data, if available; and

(b) Approve, deny or require modifications to the application and plan for the provision of emergency medical care at the special event. The Division may impose conditions on any such approval as necessary to ensure public safety.

4. If there is a material change to any of the information in an application submitted by a host organization pursuant to subsection 2, including, without limitation, a change in the location of the special event, number of persons who are expected to attend the special event or risk factors associated with the special event, the host organization shall timely notify the Division of any such change and submit to the Division a revised application for approval.

5. Before the date on which a special event is scheduled to take place, the Division may conduct an inspection of the site of the special event to verify:

(a) That the site is in compliance with the application and plan for the provision of emergency medical care at the special event approved by the Division pursuant to subsection 3;

(b) The adequacy of the routes of ingress and egress for emergency vehicles at the special event;

(c) The adequacy of the placement and accessibility of medical resources at the special event; and

(d) Any other condition the Division deems necessary to ensure that the provision of emergency medical care at the special event is adequate and in compliance with the provisions of NRS 450B.650 to 450B.700, inclusive.

6. A host organization shall not conduct a special event unless the Division has approved the application required by this section and that approval has not been revoked. The Division may deny an application or revoke its approval of an application if:

(a) The application is incomplete;

(b) The application contains false or misleading information;

(c) The plan for the provision of emergency medical care at the special event does not meet the requirements of NRS 450B.650 to 450B.700, inclusive; or

(d) The host organization does not comply with the provisions of this section or any other condition required for approval of an application.

Sec. 2. NAC 450B.700 is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 3. This regulation becomes effective on the later of:

1. January 1, 2027; or
2. The date on which this regulation is approved by the Legislative Commission and filed with the Secretary of State pursuant to NRS 233B.070.
