

Informational Statement Form – R035-26

The following statement is submitted for adopted amendments to Nevada Administrative Code (NAC) Chapter 633.

1. A clear and concise explanation of the need for the adopted regulation.

The proposed regulation is necessary to fully implement AB 483 which was enacted by the Nevada Legislature in the 2025 Legislative Session and SB 5 which was enacted by the Nevada Legislature in the 2025 Special Legislative Session to ensure that NAC 633 is amended to require the State Board of Osteopathic Medicine (“the Board”), to adopt regulations that establish a process for prioritizing the review of an application for initial licensure as a provider of health care submitted by an applicant who demonstrates that he or she will primarily practice health care in a historically underserved community. AB 483 requires the Board to allow an applicant to make such a demonstration by submitting a letter from an employer that is located in a historically underserved area that: (1) states that the applicant has accepted an offer of employment from the employer; and (2) contains certain other information. SB 5 of the 36th Special Session of the Nevada Legislature requires the Board to establish a procedure to prioritize the processing of applications for the initial issuance of a license to practice osteopathic medicine submitted by an applicant who intends to practice: (1) serving geographic areas and populations where the shortage of providers of health care is most critical, as determined by the Nevada Health Authority; or (2) in a specialty for which the need is most critical, as determined by the Authority.

2. A description of how public comment was solicited, a summary of public response, and an explanation how other interested persons may obtain a copy of the summary.

Copies of the Nevada State Board of Osteopathic Medicine’s (the “Board”) draft regulation and workshop notice were sent by email to persons who were known to have an interest in the subject of medical regulation, as well as any persons who had specifically requested such notice. These documents were also made available on the website of the Board, available at <https://bom.nv.gov>, and the website of the State of Nevada’s Legislative Council Bureau (“LCB”), available at [Legislative Counsel Bureau \(state.nv.us\)](https://legislativecounsel.nv.gov).

On March 25, 2026, the Board issued a Notice of Intent to Act Upon a Regulation, providing the proposed amendments/additions and inviting comments, questions and suggestions at an upcoming hearing of the Board on R035-26. As scheduled, a hearing was held with regard to the proposed amendments/additions to the regulations referenced herein on May 8, 2026 at 11:00 a.m, and the minutes of that meeting contain a summary of the discussion held regarding the proposed amendments. At this workshop, other than Board staff, one member of the public, Sabrina Petrel, was in attendance. No person asked to speak, nor were any public questions received. Board Executive Director, Frank DiMaggio (“DiMaggio”) did provide background on the purpose and need for the proposed amendments/additions to NAC Chapter 633 into the record for the hearing, as the minutes for the hearing so reflect.

On June 9, 2026, an appropriately noticed public hearing in conjunction with a regular meeting of the Board wherein the Board voted unanimously to approve and adopt R035-26.

The proposed regulation was adopted without change as it complies with the requirements of AB 483 which was enacted by the Nevada Legislature in the 2025 Legislative Session and SB 5 which was enacted by the Nevada Legislature in the 2025 Special Legislative Session and no public comment was given regarding the proposed regulation.
