SMALL BUSINESS IMPACT STATEMENT

EFFECTIVE DATE OF REGULATION:

Upon filing with the Nevada Secretary of State

Background:

NAC 202 provides policy for the application, eligibility and other general information for concealed firearms permits. These regulations have not kept pace with changes in statute and in the current format, require duplicative forms/applications and outdated eligibility criteria. The proposed amendment to NAC 202 reduces duplicative application requirements, aligns the regulations with statute and further provides for updates to the application for the issuance or renewal of a permit to carry a concealed firearm.

Description of Solicitation: Comments were solicited through a workshop held on April 24, 2023 and public meetings held on August 1, 2024 and December 20, 2024. No substantive comments were submitted on record or in writing during the workshop or public meetings that necessitated additional changes.
