INFORMATIONAL STATEMENT FORM

The following statement is submitted for adopted amendments to Nevada Administrative Code (NAC) Chapter 202.

1. **A clear and concise explanation of the need for the adopted regulation.**
NAC Chapter 202 is being amended to align the regulations with statute and to eliminate duplication of applications for the issuance or renewal of a permit to carry a concealed firearm.
2. **A description of how public comment was solicited, a summary of public response, and an explanation how other interested persons may obtain a copy of the summary.**
Copies of the proposed regulation amendment, notice of workshop and notices of intent to act upon the regulation were posted on the Division's public website. The notice of intent to act upon a regulation was also posted on the Nevada Public Notice website and the Nevada State Legislature website. Copies of the proposed regulation amendment, notice of workshop and notices of intent to act upon the regulation were emailed to all Nevada criminal justice agencies and were posted at the Nevada State Library, Archives and Public Records, Department of Motor Vehicles, Carson City Library, Department of Public Safety Southern Command and the Las Vegas-Clark County Library District. Public comment was solicited by seeking written comments be sent to RCCD, as well as public comment during the hearings. The Division received two questions seeking clarification from the public relating to the application for a concealed firearm permit and whether it is anticipated that legislation will change statute in reference to what buildings a concealed firearm may be carried into. The Division did not receive any public response as to the adoption of the language in the regulations.
