

**ADOPTED REGULATION OF THE NEVADA
INTERSCHOLASTIC ACTIVITIES ASSOCIATION**

AUTHORITY: § 1, NRS 385B.060.

A REGULATION relating to interscholastic activities; revising provisions governing the cancellation of games, contests or meets by member schools; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel’s Digest:

Existing law requires the Nevada Interscholastic Activities Association to adopt rules and regulations concerning interscholastic activities and events. (NRS 385B.060) Existing regulations prohibit a school from cancelling a game, contest or meet unless the school obtains the approval of the Executive Director of the Association. Existing regulations also authorize the Association to suspend the membership of a school that violates this prohibition. (NAC 385B.306) **Section 1** of this regulation requires the Association to impose certain penalties if a school cancels a game, contest or meet less than 24 hours before the scheduled start time of the game, contest or meet. Specifically, **section 1** requires the Association to: (1) fine the school; and (2) require the school to reimburse the opposing school or school district for any costs incurred. **Section 1** also provides that such penalties do not apply if the Executive Director determines that extraordinary circumstances justify the cancellation.

Section 1. NAC 385B.306 is hereby amended to read as follows:

385B.306 1. A school shall not cancel a game, contest or meet unless it obtains the approval of the Executive Director.

2. *Except as otherwise provided in subsection 3, if a school cancels a game, contest or meet less than 24 hours before the scheduled start time of the game, contest or meet, the Association will:*

(a) Fine the school in accordance with the provisions of NAC 385B.960; and

(b) Require the school to reimburse the opposing school or school district for any costs incurred, as determined by the Executive Director.

3. The provisions of subsection 2 do not apply if the Executive Director determines that extraordinary circumstances justify the cancellation.

4. If a school withdraws its membership in the Association during a season, the school shall indicate on its record “no contest” for each game, contest or meet that is completed by the school after the withdrawal.

~~3.~~ 5. The Association may suspend the membership of a school in the Association if the school violates any provision of this section.
