R109-26

A clear and concise explanation of the need for the adopted regulation:

Existing law requires the Peace Officer Standards and Training Commission to adopt regulations establishing minimum standards for the certification, decertification, recruitment, selection and training of peace officers. (NRS 289.510)

This regulation change will increase the minimum hours required for basic training for category I (from 480 to 725) and II (200 to 270) academies, bringing Nevada closer to the industry standards nationally. This regulation change will require all category I basic academies be in person and eliminate certain subjects from category I training. Subjects removed from the category I minimum standards are not category I subjects, which increased training hours in areas not as important for this category. This regulation change will put the focus back on actual category I training subjects.

A workshop was held April 30, 2026, where public comment was accepted during the workshop and regularly scheduled meeting held immediately after the workshop.
