

INFORMATIONAL STATEMENT

R110-26

A clear and concise explanation of the need for the adopted regulation:

Existing regulation requires the Peace Officer Standards and Training Commission to adopt regulations establishing minimum standards for the certification, decertification, recruitment, selection and training of peace officers. (NRS 289.510).

Existing language states the Executive Director shall certify any basic training course presented by an agency. This adopted regulation will allow the Executive Director the latitude to not certify an academy presented by an agency that is not the same category as that agency is designated by statute. For example, a category II agency should not be able to certify a category I peace officer basic academy. The required training for category I exceeds the training for category II peace officers. Based on past practice, these types of academies were for profit and not in the best interest of peace officer training in Nevada.

The second addition to this regulation would require every academy provide proof, upon request for certification, of an adequate training location for Emergency Vehicle Operations (EVOC) and that all performance objectives can be met at this location.

The third change to this regulation removes the obsolete training requirement which required training in the use of the carotid restraint/lateral vascular neck restraint for all agencies authorized to use it. This training requirement was repealed by Assembly Bill No.3 of the 32nd Special Session.
