

Statement pursuant to NRS 233B.0608(4)

The Board of Psychological Examiners' determination is that there is no direct or significant burden upon a small business or the formation of a small business.

Reasons for that are, a workshop and a public hearing were held. September 12, 2014, and January 15, 2016. Attendance at the workshop was 27 public members, 7 Board members, and Board office staff. In the original draft of the regulation Behavior Analytic small business indicated limiting the number of CABIs they could supervise would cause many problems with their businesses. A reprint was requested, but further discussion of the regulation was put on hold during the legislative session. During the 79<sup>th</sup> session, CABIs were removed from the purview of the Board. Therefore, the regulation was altered to remove all mentioning of CABI from NAC 641, and eliminated the issues raised at the public workshop.

The Public hearing was 8 public members, 7 Board members and Board office staff. As the regulation was provided to all impacted parties through public workshop and hearing notices, and no negative impact was stated by any small business owners present or through written comment at the public hearing, the Board concluded that there will be no negative impact on small businesses.
