Small Business Impact Statement for R177-22

EFFECTIVE DATE OF REGULATION: Upon filing with the Nevada Secretary of State

1. Background:

The proposed regulation updates existing regulations to be consistent with other provisions of law, to clarify existing requirements in the law, to prescribe the requirements for physicians and physician assistants when supervising nonablative esthetic medical procedures and to allow the Board to charge reduced application fees for applicants for licensure by endorsement for practitioners of respiratory care or perfusionists if those applicants are active members of, or the spouse of, an active member of, the Armed Forces of the United States, a veteran or the surviving spouse of a veteran.

2. Description of Solicitation:

Copies of the proposed regulation, notice of workshop and notice of intent to act upon the regulation were sent by U.S. mail and emailed to persons who were known to have an interest in the subject of medical regulation, as well as any persons who had specifically requested such notice. These documents were also made available on the website of the Nevada State Board of Medical Examiners, available at http://medboard.nv.gov/About/Proposed Regulations/, the website of the Legislative Counsel Bureau, available at https://www.leg.state.nv.us/App/Notice/A/, the Department of Administration website, available at notice.nv.gov.
