AUTHORITY: §1, NRS 385.080 and section 1 of Assembly Bill No. 52 of the 72nd Session of the Nevada Legislature, chapter 65, Statutes of Nevada 2003, at page 444.

- **Section 1.** Chapter 389 of NAC is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to read as follows:
- 1. To receive a standard high school diploma in accordance with the provisions of section 1 of Assembly Bill No. 52 of the 72nd Session of the Nevada Legislature, chapter 65, Statutes of Nevada 2003, at page 444, a veteran who satisfies the qualifications set forth in that section may submit to the Office of Veterans' Services an application on a form prescribed for this purpose by the State Board of Education. In addition, a family member of a deceased veteran may submit an application if the deceased veteran satisfies the qualifications set forth in section 1 of Assembly Bill No. 52 of the 72nd Session of the Nevada Legislature, chapter 65, Statutes of Nevada 2003, at page 444. Such an application must:
- (a) Be accompanied by a copy of the certificate of honorable discharge issued to the veteran or a certified copy of the form DD214 issued to the veteran; and
- (b) Indicate the secondary school in Nevada which the veteran attended before he left to serve in the Armed Forces of the United States.

- 2. Upon determination that an application is complete and is accompanied by the material required by subsection 1, the Office of Veterans' Services will forward the application to the appropriate school district on the veteran's behalf.
- 3. Upon receipt of an application approved pursuant to subsection 2, a school district may issue a standard high school diploma to the veteran. Such a diploma may be presented to the veteran or the family member of the deceased veteran, as applicable:
 - (a) During a graduation ceremony regularly conducted in that school district;
 - (b) During a special ceremony conducted in that school district for veterans; or
 - (c) By mailing the diploma to the veteran or his family member.
