


EIGHTH JUDICIAL DISTRICT COURT SPECIALTY COURT FUNDING UPDATE - AOC GENERAL FUND ALLOCATION September 27, 2016


The Nevada Supreme Court's Administrative Office of the Courts (AOC) through its specialty court funding committee has approved funding in the amount of \$652,438 for Adult Drug Court and \$712,938 and \$802,938 for Mental Health Court in FY 2016 and 2017 respectively. The FY 2017 allocation for mental health court included dedicated participant slots for limited jurisdiction courts (37 LVJC and 13 outlying). In addition, the AOC approved partial funding (\$49,178) for a Veterans Treatment Court Coordinator for FY 2017.

The Eighth Judicial District Court received its first disbursement in November of 2015. Attachment one and two details the FY 2016 year-end program statistics. As you can see, as of July 31, 2016, we had 59 current active clients in mental health court and 60 in adult drug court. As of today, we have 80 current active general fund clients participating in mental health court and 87 general fund clients participating in drug court. In total, with all funding sources we are serving 342 adult drug court participants and 147 mental health court clients that would otherwise be on probation through general supervision or in prison.

Because of the relatively late start in FY 2016, the Eighth Judicial District Court returned \$1,167,196 in unspent general fund money. However, FY 2017 appears to be on track.

When analyzing the most recent three consecutive months of June, July, August, you will see in the charts below that mental health court is averaging \$59,913 per month which projects to \$719,000 in total annual expenditures. This does not include \$90,000 that will go to SNAMHS for a dedicated LCSW for mental health court evaluations in the jails. In drug court, the average cost per month is \$31,909 which projects to \$383,000. In sum, mental health court is unlikely to return any general fund allocation and at this time, drug court (assuming no additional growth) may return approximately \$269,438.
