CREATION

The Commission on Special License Plates is authorized by *Nevada Revised Statutes* (NRS) 482.367004.

MEMBERS

The Commission consists of five voting members and three nonvoting members. The voting members must be legislators, including the legislators who served as chairs of the Assembly Committee on Transportation and the Senate Committee on Transportation during the most recent legislative session, or their designees. The Legislative Commission appoints the voting members for a term of two years, commencing on July 1 of each odd-numbered year, and vacancies must be filled in the same manner. The nonvoting members are the directors of the Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV), the Department of Public Safety, and the Department of Tourism and Cultural Affairs, or their designees. Members of the Commission serve without salary or compensation for their travel or per diem expenses.

COMMITTEE RESPONSIBILITIES

The Commission on Special License Plates was established by the 2003 Legislature through the passage of Assembly Bill 358. The Commission recommends to the DMV, the approval of applications for special license plates, as defined in NRS 482.367008, and the issuance of the special license plates by the DMV. Prior to its establishment, special license plates were authorized solely through legislative action. The earliest special plates were intended to identify public-owned vehicles that were exempt from the registration fees and to identify Nevada members of the United States Congress. Over the years, bills were enacted authorizing additional special plates to recognize public service, honor certain military veterans, and recognize certain other groups.

The Legislature initially placed a 25 design cap on the production of special license plates and provided a mechanism to cease issuance of low-demand plates. The 2011 Legislature passed legislation, which raised the maximum from 25 to 30, the number of separate designs of special license plates that the DMV may issue at any one time. Subsection 2 of NRS 482.367008 provides for the limit of the 30 special license plates that may be authorized by the Commission in what is commonly referred to as the “first tier.” For plates included in this tier, an organization must post with the DMV a surety bond in the amount of \$5,000 and maintain at least 1,000 active registrations.

The 2013 Legislature approved A.B. 189, which created a “second tier” of not more than five special license plates that may be issued by the DMV. Subsection 3 of NRS 482.367008 provides for the second tier of special license plates, in which an applicant must post a \$20,000 surety bond and maintain at least 3,000 active registrations.

SPONSORING A NEW SPECIALTY LICENSE PLATE

Established non-profit organizations that are registered with the Nevada Office of the Secretary of State or governmental agencies may request a specialty license plate. Plates may also be requested through the State Legislature.

Pursuant to NRS 482.367002, in order to request a specialty license plate, it must be shown that it will generate financial support for services to the community relating to public health, education, or general welfare. The plate may not promote, advertise or endorse any specific product, brand name, or service or promote any specific religion, faith, or anti-religious belief.

The Commission reviews any applications to sponsor a new specialty license plate and makes a recommendation to the DMV regarding whether a plate should be issued. The DMV makes the final determination.

SPECIAL LICENSE PLATES: REVENUE

As of September 30, 2017, there were 276,079 active special license plates, and the plates had generated approximately \$63.6 million in revenue since Fiscal Year 1998. The most widely issued plate has been the Las Vegas Commemorative plate, with 91,911 active plates. As of September 30, 2017, this plate has generated approximately \$23.1 million in revenue. Revenue from a special license plate that is returned to an organization is generated through an initial issuance fee of \$15 to \$25 and a renewal fee of \$10 to \$20, depending on the design. These fees are in addition to all other applicable registration and license fees and governmental services taxes. A table showing the number of plates and revenue by year is contained in Appendix B.

PAST COMMITTEE ACTION

At the conclusion of the 2015–2016 Interim, the Committee submitted one of its ten allocated bill draft requests (BDRs) to the 2017 Legislative Session. If approved, A.B. 442 would have authorized certain organizations with an approved special license plate to apply to the DMV for a redesign of the plate after the plate had been in effect for at least five years. The Commission would approve or deny any application for plate redesign. In addition, the measure provided for a change to the fee structure to account for redesigned special license plates. Assembly Bill 442 did not pass during the 2017 Legislative Session.

APPENDIX A

APPLICATION PROCESS FOR SPECIALTY LICENSE PLATES

SPECIALTY LICENSE PLATE DEVELOPMENT PROCESS

Plate development will begin once all required documentation is submitted and the Commission on Special License Plates recommends approval of the application.

- If legislation is passed in favor of a sponsoring organization to develop a new specialty license plate, the organization will be referred to the Commission on Special License Plates for recommendation of approval.
- A person on behalf of an organization may request a special license plate be made without legislation.

Application

- Submit a completed Specialty License Plate Application (form SP-68 or SP68A) to the Department.
- With the application a surety bond in the amount of \$5,000 or \$20,000 must be submitted.
- The Commission on Special License Plates will release the bond if the license plate is not made or, upon the yearly audit there are at least 1,000 or 3,000 active registered vehicles utilizing the license plate.
- Submit proof the special license plate will only generate financial support for the following:
 - For a government entity or an organization that is established as a nonprofit charitable organization which provides services to the community relating to public health, education, or general welfare.
 - The organization must be registered with the Secretary of State, if required by law. A copy of the business license must be submitted.
 - The name and purpose of the organization does not promote, advertise, or endorse any specific product, brand name, or service that is offered for profit and is nondiscriminatory.
 - The license plate does not promote any specific religion, faith, or antireligious belief.
- The application for a special license plate must include a budget which includes the proposed operating and administrative expenses of the organization. The applicant must amend and update the application if the organization has prepared a new budget before the license plate is issued.

License Plate Approval

- Documentation will be submitted to Central Services and Records Division for review, then the Director's office, the Director will submit to the Commission on Special License Plates for recommendation of approval.
- *When the Department has determined it will issue the plate, the Department will notify the person who requested the plate, the organization, and the Commission.*
- *Upon the Department's approval of a plate, the sponsoring organization must submit to the Commission in writing, the methods and procedures used to award grants with the money received from the sale of license plates. The Commission shall review and approve the procedures.*
- If approved a meeting will be set up to discuss account codes, design, and souvenir plates.
- The sponsoring agency may request displaying of the license plate on the DMV website; a camera-ready design must accompany the request.
- The license plate design must meet the standards set in NRS 482.270. The left-hand one-third of the license plate is the only part of the license plate on which any design or insignia can be displayed.
- The sponsoring organization/artist must submit a letter relinquishing any proprietary rights and assign all rights of the design to the Department.
- Once law enforcement has approved the license plate, the Department Director will make the final decision as to the acceptability of the license plate.
- The first 50 to 100 license plates may be reserved for the sponsoring organization. The organization must notify the Department, in writing, of the reserved license plate number, person, and office location where the individual will register the new license plate. License plates will be held for a maximum of 3 months.
- Trailer license and motorcycle plates are available.
- Souvenir license plates are available for purchase, to the sponsoring organization.

Annual Review by the Commission on Special License Plates

- The sponsoring organization must submit a balance sheet and recent bank statement by September 1 of each year fiscal year on a form provided by the Commission.
- On or before July 1 of each fiscal year, the sponsoring organization must provide to the Commission and the DMV:
 - A list of the names of the persons, whether or not designated officers, who are responsible for overseeing the operation of the organization.
 - The organization's current mailing address, email address and telephone number.
 - A report on the budget of the organization, including a description of how the money received from additional fees was expended, and any recipient or rewarder of that money.
 - A copy of the most recent federal tax return of the organization, including any related tax schedules.
 - Copy of current surety bond.
- On or before July 1 of each fiscal year, a non-profit organization shall also post on the organization's website or publish in a newspaper of general circulation in the county where the organization is based, the most recent federal tax return of the organization, including any related tax schedules.

The Commission on Special License Plates may request the Legislative Commission to direct the Legislative Auditor to perform an audit of a sponsoring non-profit organization if the Commission has reason to believe that the organization has filed forms or records that are inadequate or inaccurate, has committed improper financial practices, has failed to use adequate methods to ensure money received from plates is expended solely for the benefit of the intended recipient, or determines that an audit is necessary to assist the Commission in administering any provisions of the law.

The Commission on Special License Plates may recommend that a plate be discontinued if the Nevada legislative auditor determines that a non-profit group has committed any acts of improper financial administration. The sponsoring organization will be given an opportunity for a hearing. The DMV makes the final decision (NRS 482.38279).



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FIRST TIER SPECIALTY LICENSE PLATE APPLICATION

NRS 482

Any person or organization may request the Department of Motor Vehicles to design, prepare, and issue a special license plate by meeting all the requirements and submitting this application to the Department.

A surety bond in the amount of \$5,000 is required.

Applicants may submit suggestions for the design and colors with this application.

The surety herein reserves the right to withdraw as such surety except as to any liability already incurred or accrued hereunder.
